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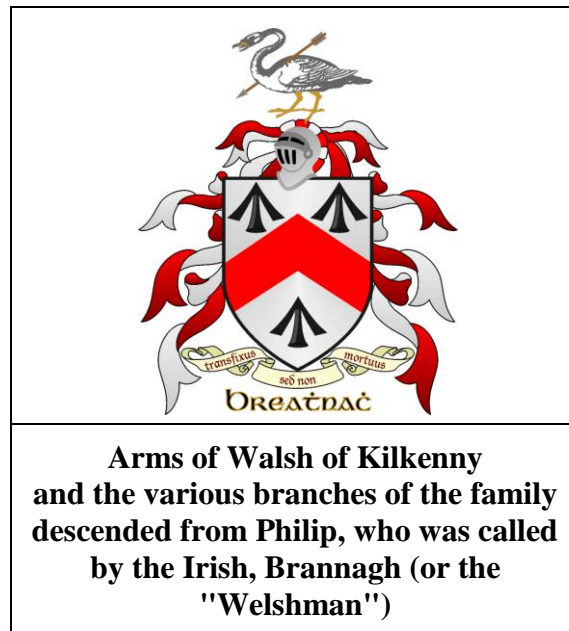

RICE-WELCH: (June 9, 1976, Walton Reporter) - In a candlelight service Saturday, May 15, in the United Methodist church of Walton, Miss Frances J. Welch and William E. Rice, both of Walton, were united in marriage by Rev. Edwin N.P. Hempel in a double ring ceremony.

The bride is the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Bert Welch of Walton while the bridegroom is the son of Mrs. Ethel M. Rice of Munnsville and the late Ernest Rice.

Arrangements of mint and yellow daisies, white carnations and baby's breath surrounded the altar. Mrs. Harold Combs of Walton was the organist while J. Richard Kinch and Mrs. William Hastings, both of Walton, sang.

The bride's attire and the attendants' gown were made by Mrs. Louise Brundage. The bridal veil was three-tiered, fingertip length, of French illusion attached to a lace headpiece. Her dress was floor-length of white crepe over taffeta. Bodice and cummerbund were Venise lace and crepe over taffeta, trimmed with sequins and seed pearls. About 200 were at the reception in the church dining room with Mrs. Alice Brundage of Walton the cateress. Pouring were Mrs. Lillavene DuMond, Mrs. Marie VanKleeck, Mrs. Charlotte Benedict, all of Walton. Mrs. Linda Thompson was in charge of the guest book.

The bride is employed by Bronson-Smith Motors, Inc., Walton, while her husband works for Hermann Forwarding Co., Walton.

When the couple left on a wedding trip to Virginia, the bride selected a two-piece apricot dress and jacket ensemble with white accessories and white cymbidium orchid.

Wedding invitation: "Mr. and Mrs. Asa Budine request the pleasure of your company at the marriage of their son Leslie M. to Miss Viola M. Gilbert Tuesday evening, January 1st, 1895, at their residence on Pine's Brook, at nine o'clock, Walton, N.Y."

MR. BUDINE BEGINS HIS WORK: From the Walton Reporter (year unknown): New Superintendent of Highways Putting Town Roads in Shape for the winter. The new superintendents of highways, who were elected in the different towns of this county, took the oath of office within a day or two and on Thursday assumed their new duties, their terms of office beginning at once.

County superintendent of highways VanTassle is busy conferring with these officials in the various towns, and helping them to get started in their work.

Mr. VanTassle was in Walton Friday and Monday consulting with Leslie M. Budine, the new superintendent of highways in this town.

Mr. Budine already has several men at work opening ditches and cleaning out sluices in various parts of the town, preparatory for winter. As soon as the weather is more favorable he expects to employ many more men for a day or two each in this work, hoping to get the roads in good condition to stand the winter weather, and to afford proper drainage in the spring so as to avoid as much washing as possible.

Mr. Budine plans to make numerous changes in the system of working the roads in this town, but most of them will not be put into operation until spring, all that he can do now being to get the roads in as good shape as possible for winter, and to do the work as cheaply as he can.

FLOWERS: From the Walton Reporter, 1942...A bunch of purple violets was picked on the L.M. Budine farm at Pines on Tuesday, Oct. 20.

MAN IN SHACK: From the Walton Reporter, date unknown...Walton Man Found Seriously Ill in Dilapidated Shack. Albert Howland, 72, Missing About Town, Found by Leslie Budine. Walton, Oct. 7.

In a dirty shack, which is in a most dilapidated condition, on Bob's Brook, Albert Howland, 72, was found by Leslie Budine lying on the floor in so weakened condition that he could not move. Mr. Budine had wondered at the whereabouts of Howland as he had not seen him in some time, so he made a special visit to the shack Thursday afternoon to see if he could locate him. The door was unlocked, and Howland, when he heard someone at the door, feebly called, 'Come in', so Budine walked in and found the man in an exhausted condition on the floor, where he had lain all day. Food was immediately furnished him and he was made as comfortable as possible. Dr. E. Ray Gladstone was called to the scene Friday afternoon. When he saw the conditions at the shack, he immediately contacted Frank Cadwood, local poor worker.

Cadwood called the ambulance of A.J. Holmes & Co., and Howland was taken to the county farm at Delhi, where he will probably spend the winter.

Howland was exhausted because of the lack of food and being an old man, his strength soon gave way so it was impossible for him to call for help. Were it not for the thoughtfulness of Mr. Budine, Mr. Howland would probably have died alone."

OBITUARY: Buried at Walton, NY Cemetery. Leslie M. Budine died at the Stevens Hospital in Walton, NY Tuesday, 9/3/1940. He entered the hospital for an operation about 12 days before that and was making a good recovery when stricken by a cerebral hemorrhage which caused his death. He was born in the town of Colchester and moved to Walton while still a child, and lived most of his life on the farm at Pines. He was well known throughout Walton Township, having served as superintendent of highways. He was also a member of the Delaware county unit of the Dairy Farmers' Union.

For years he owned and operated the Leslie Budine store and filling station on the corner of Route 10 and Bob's Brook road in Walton, NY. He was a good father and a kind neighbor and always willing to help those who needed his aid and a faithful worker in every cause in which he believed. He is survived by his 8 children and by a half brother Herman Budine. The funeral was held at his home Thursday at 2 p.m., Rev. Grant Robinson, pastor of the Methodist church, of which he was a member, officiating. Burial was in the Walton cemetery.

According to Mrs. Gerdon Budine, Grandma Gilbert (from Bob's Brook) had a spring run - a trench dug in the cellar and used that for refrigeration. They had a "dumb waiter" on pulleys to raise and lower the milk, butter, etc.

She is survived by a son, Gerdon Budine, Sidney Center; five daughters, Mrs. Daisy Schriber, South Edmeston, Mrs. Bernice Bartow, Walton, Miss Eunice Budine and Mrs. Vivian Brundage, both of Schenectady, Mrs. Francis McAdams, Walton; three sisters, Mrs. Minnie Gilbert and Mrs. Cora Cole, both of Walton and Mrs. Carrie Wright, Franklin; a brother, Alfred Gilbert, Walton; 28 grandchildren; 42 great-grandchildren. She was born March 30, 1876 in Dryden the daughter of John Gilbert and Hannah Phoenix. She was married Jan. 1, 1895 to Leslie Budine in Walton. Mrs. Budine was a member of the First Methodist Church of Walton and the Women's Relief Corp. Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 2 p.m. from the Lyon Brothers Chapel, Walton. The Rev. Henry G. Lincoln will officiate. Friends may call at the funeral chapel today from 2 to 4 and 7 to 9 p.m. and until time of service.

Notes: **HEART BALM:** From the Walton Reporter, July 1, 1922: The case of Irene Lent versus Lawrence Budine to recover damages for alleged breach of promise, formerly slated for trial at this term of Delhi court, has been settled by mutual agreement without further litigation. The case grew out of an affair between Lawrence Budine of Walton, and Irene Lent of Cornwall-on Hudson. Lawrence, it is said, was bestowing, freely, his affections upon the receptive Miss Lent, with the

ultimate result that a future marriage was arranged for by the two. At a later time and before the carrying out of former plans, Mr. Budine decided upon a change of affections and was accordingly married to Mrs. Hazel Lakin of Walton. Miss Lent, at hearing of this, at once arrived at the decision that nothing short of the payment of a few hundred dollars to her by Budine would possibly heal the heart wound caused by the alleged falsity of Budine. Suit was accordingly instituted and the case came to trial in Delhi court, where the jury decided that the proper heart balm was \$1700.50. The case was appealed and was coming into court on the present calendar, for the third time. But now the case is settled and Walton rejoices that her native son and prominent businessman is again free. Besides, four hundred dollars is somewhat different than \$1700.50.

Cigar smoking Lawrence "Uncle Butch" owned businesses in Walton, was a guard at Scintilla in Sidney and ran Budine's Taxi service in Walton with his wife Hazel for several years.

Walton Reporter, July 1928: A number of weddings marked the ebbing of the month of June in this village. Outstanding among them was the marriage of Miss Eunice Budine, 1928 student of the Walton High School, to John E. Elderkin, also of Walton and a former student of the high school. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Grant E. Robinson, pastor of the Walton First Methodist Church, in the parsonage, late Saturday afternoon. Paul Budine, cousin of the bride, acted as best man while Beatrice Elderkin, sister of the bridegroom, attended the bride. The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leslie M. Budine, of Walton, while the bridegroom is the son of Mrs. Elmer Elderkin, also of Walton. Following their honeymoon trip to Albany and Saratoga Springs, the Elderkins will reside in Walton.

After her divorce from John Elderkin, Eunice worked for several years as a salesclerk for Franklin stores in Schenectady. She retired as a clerk at the F.M. Fields Department store in Schenectady. Later, she moved back to Walton where she died of cancer. She took back her maiden name after the divorce.

Walton Reporter, Jan 4, 1940: Annual ice harvest has started on the Loudon pond, South street, Walton, where 10-inch ice is being harvested. Shown hauling cakes on the sled is George Harrington. Feeding ice into the chute is Ogden Foote, while Gerdon Budine pushes ice cakes into the loading canal.

Note written by his wife Anne: "I remember sitting in Smiths hospital on your 21st birthday. Your Dad Leslie passed away

that afternoon, Sept. 2, 1940."

His Selective Service System Draft Registration card, issued 22 June 1944, shows he was issued a draft code of 2-C (Agricultural deferment).

Walton Reporter, 1960: Unadilla Couple Hurt; He Gets Summons. Gerdon B. Budine, 41, and his wife, Ann, 40, both of Unadilla, R.D. 1, suffered fractured vertebrae Saturday morning when their car was involved in a crash with a tractor-trailer on Route 7 when both vehicles were headed east. Mr. Budine also received a summons for an unsafe turn which is returnable before Town of Afton Justice Arthur Grover. State police at Sidney said that Mr. Budine was heading east when he attempted to make a left turn just as the rig operated by Earl B. Steele, Clayton, attempted to pass. The tractor-trailer was forced into the guardrails and the Budine car went into a ditch.

LEATHERCRAFT: Walton Reporter, January 1972: Leathercraft Work All Began With a Play Kit. A series of mishaps in his life set Gerdon Budine of Unadilla RD 1 on a course which gave him a new hobby and now a major vocation. Their hobby actually started for the Budines in 1969 when Mr.

Budine was laid up for a few months with Meniere's disease, an ailment affecting the balancing factor of the inner ear. Their daughter, Kay Roof of Sidney Center, bought him a beginner's kit for leather working. On Jan. 28, 1970, Mr. Budine and his wife, Anne, suffered serious injuries in a traffic accident in Afton vicinity which yielded both of them with broken backs. There followed long.....

At first he shunned the kit with the objection that he is "no artist." But because she cared enough to get it for him he broke into it one day and became a captive artisan. Today Mr. Budine works in leather craft every chance he gets, and with his wife operates Anne's Gift Shop on the Walton-Sidney road near Sidney Center in a small trailer where is also located his tiny workshop. He sounds like a cowboy when he talks about "pounding leather" but that's what it amounts to when Gerdon Budine takes a piece of leather, punch and hammer and starts to fashion a handbag or billfold. Anne assists by working with other offerings of the shop--belts, suede leather articles, decorative items. She also does the lacing on the products of her husband's bench.

Recently, a reporter's attention was drawn to a handbag which had been crafted from leather. It featured a picture of the former Leslie Budine store and filling station once located the corner of Route 10 and the Bob's Brook road. It was more realistic than the snapshot from which it was taken because this was Gerdon Budine's home ground many years ago.

The Budines find that their hobby not only brings in extra income but it leads to new friendships at the art shows they attend. Next year they plan to do some traveling while the one child remaining at home is in Europe. Along with them, naturally, will be a supply of leather articles.

Customers occasionally have strange requests. One wife had "My love to you, honey" stenciled inside a billfold, Another person in the business of raising goats had a goat placed on his billfold; another person not at all related to the first one also requested the goat picture.

He put a picture of a Franklin church on a key case and a member of the church snapped it up almost before it was completed. Some of the customers include work associates in Department 29 at The Bendix Corporation in Sidney, where Mrs. Budine is also employed.

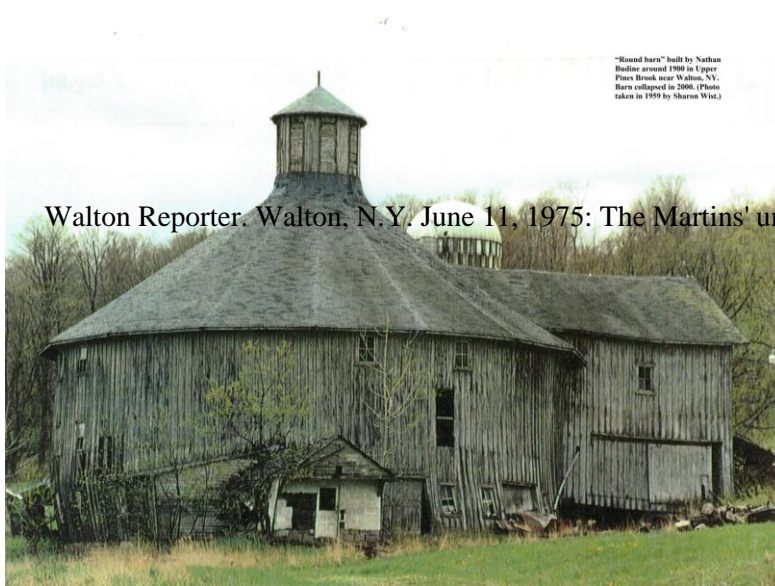

Notes for Moses (Bodine) Budine

NOTES TAKEN BY ROBERT E. BUDINE, OMAHA, NEBRASKA:

Moses Budine 1806 -1893 was the second son of Jacob Bodine (Jr.) and Hilletjie Clover. Jacob Bodine born about 1770 was the son of Jacob Bodine (Sr.) and Elizabeth Newkirk. (The Jr. and Sr. designations are presumptions at this point.) As of May 1998 we had not positively determined how or when the spelling of Moses' last name was changed from Bodine to Budine. There is a possibility the change occurred during a census and was never corrected for spelling nor pronunciation. Another and more interesting possibility, handed down through the Herman Budine branch (Bruce), is that Moses, aunt became angry with the rest of the family and had his last name legally changed. Moses Budine died in Walton, NY Dec 14, 1893 at age 87 of bronchial consumption (old age). He is buried in Walton Cemetery in the lower section back of the Asa Budine lot.

CENSUSES:

1810 Census: He's probably one of three males under 10 in the 1810 Delaware Co., NY Census.

1850 Census: Moses and Catherine had 6 sons and 5 daughters all living in their household at Andes, NY where they had moved in 1849. Catherine and Moses were cousins. In the 1850 Census, Moses was spelled "Meosis." In an 1855 Census his last name was spelled "Bodine."

1855 NY State Census: Moses and family are listed as living in Andes, District 1, family 43. Mrs. Robert Burghart could find no record of wife Catherine's death.

1880 Census: In Hancock, Delaware Co., NY, there is a Moses (73), Alvira (44), Edd (19), and John Bodine (40) in one house.

Notes for Alvira ?

In the 1880 Census of Hancock, Delaware Co., NY, there is a Moses (73), Alvira (44), Edd (19), and John Bodine (40) in one house. In the 1900 Census of Hancock, Alvira is listed as John's stepmother. Alvira must have married Moses, John's father, when she was relatively young as compared to Moses. Here we see the name going back and forth between Budine and Bodine. This would lend credence to the idea that the name Budine may have started out as Bodine.

Notes for John Harding Phoenix

ANTI-RENT WAR: From the American Encyclopedia: Anti-rent Movement, a political protest against the semi-manorial system of land tenures in New York state. It began in Albany in 1839 and spread throughout the central part of the state. In the 17th century the Dutch and the English had granted large tracts of public land to the Van Rensselaer, Livingston, and other families. The land had then been leased to tenant farmers, who paid annual rents and taxes, owed feudal obligations, and had no rights to mines or mill sites. This system continued well into the 19th century, but, by the 1830's, Hudson Valley farmers believed that the leaseholds were a direct violation of the Declaration of Independence. It was time, they felt, to abolish slavery, promote temperance, and end an economic system that relegated them to being semi-serfs.

The event that catalyzed the anti-rent agitation was the death of Stephen Van Rensselaer, the landlord of a large estate in Albany and Rensselaer counties. His will instructed his two heirs to collect \$400,000 in back rent in order to balance outstanding debts, but their attempts to obey the injunction met with resistance and promoted similar demonstrations on neighboring estates. The anti-renters, dressed as Indians, resisted state militia units and tarred and feathered hostile sheriffs. A high pitch of violence was reached on August 7, 1845, when Deputy Sheriff Osman Steele was killed in Delaware County. Governor Silas Wright declared a state of insurrection. More than 50 men were tried and convicted, and two of them received life sentences for their actions.

The campaign of violence had failed, but the anti-rent movement was not ended. Both the Whigs and the Democrats recognized the value of farmer support. In June 1846 the state constitutional convention, meeting in Albany, abolished manorial obligations and limited leases to 12 years. In the subsequent gubernatorial election, Whig candidate John Young, with anti-rent endorsements, defeated incumbent Wright. Young redeemed his campaign promises, pardoning the participants in the Steele murder and directing his attorney general to institute proceedings against defective titles. The great estates were being gradually divided, and the ballot box, not tar and feathers, led to the anti-rent victory.

James Fenimore Cooper described incidents in the anti-rent movement from a conservative position in "The Littlepage Manuscripts", a trilogy consisting of the novels "Satanstoe" (1845), "The Chainbearer" (1845), and "The Redskins" (1846).

OBITUARY: Walton Reporter, Dec 1908: Was in Anti-Rent War and Later Fought for the Union in Civil War--John Phoenix Dies at Ripe Age of 90 Years. John Phoenix died at his home at Cleaver Dec. 19th, in his 90th year. Deceased was born at Cabin Hill July 27, 1819, town of Andes, where his father, one of the early settlers of the county, had moved to as early as 1794 and settled on a farm. He grew up with the county and was a rugged, healthy man up to a few weeks before his death. He participated in the anti-rent riots during the early 40's and was one of the band who were brought to Delhi jail for the shooting of Deputy Sheriff Osmond Steel and with the rest of the party was confined for a time [in Dannemora State Prison] and afterwards pardoned by Gov. Young. Shortly after being pardoned he married Margaret Munson, who died 9 years ago. From that union he leaves behind him to mourn his loss 4 children, 28 grandchildren, 22 great-grandchildren; a record to be proud of as a sturdy pioneer of Delaware county. On September 2, 1864, he enlisted as a Union private in the Civil War, being a member of Co. G, 144th N.Y.V.I., and was discharged 9 months and 23 days later on June 25, 1865 with chronic diarrhea. Shortly after the war or in 1870, he moved to the farm at Cleaver, (P.O. address, Loomis) then known as Loomis brook where he died. He was a hard working, industrious man and with his noble wife soon cleared up the place and had it one of the best paying farms in the valley. Born at a time when schools were few and land must be cleared, he did not have the advantages of an education but made sure his children should. He could neither read or write.

Since the death of his wife his son Aaron and wife have tenderly cared for him. The funeral was held at his late residence Tuesday, the 22nd, at 11 a.m., conducted by the Rev. Gritman of Cannonsville. Interment in the family plot at Trout Creek cemetery. The children are Aaron, at home; Hannah, wife of John Gilbert; Estelle, wife of Aaron Franks; Annie, wife of James Constable. Cause of death was old age and an attack of heart trouble.

MISC: According to Marianne (McCaffrey) Greenfield, John was a prisoner in Andersonville during the Civil War and returned home with his hair turned completely white. Lucille Dewey's records indicate that he entered the Civil War Sep 1864 for 1 year as PVT in the 144th NYV. His age was listed as 43 born in Delaware County and married.

Notes for Margaret Emily Munson

OBITUARY: May have been Margaret Davis? Mrs. John Phoenix, who died at her home in Cleaver December 19, was born in Middletown, Delaware county, sixty-nine years ago. Her maiden name was Margaret Munson. She was married to Mr. Phoenix, or "Uncle John" as he is familiarly called, fifty-six years ago, and God's blessings have been upon them all those years. She was ever ready to lend a helping hand to the sick and afflicted, and not a boy or girl under twenty-five years of age for miles around but what were first fondly handled by her with few exceptions. In her girlhood days she waited for her John to return from the anti-rent war and in 1864, with her children around her, she again waited for her John to come home from the war. After the war they removed to Cleaver where she has since resided, surrounded by many friends and no enemies. She was only sick six days and quickly fell asleep without a struggle and without a pain. She leaves besides her husband one son, Aaron, and three daughters, Mrs. John Gilbert, Mrs. James Constable and Mrs. Aaron Franks, and several grandchildren. The funeral was largely attended at her late home on Friday. Rev. Jared Wells, of East Sidney, officiated. Interment at Trout Creek.

Notes: OBITUARY: Walton Reporter, 30 Sep 1922: Aaron Phoenix died at his home at Cleaver Thursday morning, Sept. 21, after a lingering illness of many months from cancer. Mr. Phoenix was born in the town of Middletown 73 years ago and while yet a young man his parents, with their children, moved to the farm at Cleaver, where he died. Here he became acquainted with and afterwards married Kate Constable who lived on an adjoining farm. For some years after marriage he worked out around the neighborhood but some forty years ago he returned to his father's farm, putting his savings into the place, and spent the balance of his life's toil upon that farm.

Mr. Phoenix was a tireless worker, a man who knew not the meaning of the word rest. From sun to sun he was everlastingly working and all that time working for the welfare of his family, his only thought; honest, upright and faithful in all his dealings, he was one of the best liked men in that territory of the town of Tompkins. He had a keen interest in everything that went to make the town a success. A Republican in politics, he was no bigot. He could look over the fence and if satisfied he would not hesitate to support the opposition. There was no hypocrisy in his makeup and he was not afraid to express himself freely and never hesitated to ask a question if he did not understand. He was the type of farmer that makes farming worthwhile. He was no dairyman, he was a farmer, and few are the luxuries of today that go on our tables that Aaron Phoenix did not raise on his farm.

He never had nor was he ever known to have a poor crop and all that work, all that energy was for the welfare of his family, whom he dearly loved. His home was always open and the latch string always out.

He leaves to mourn his loss his wife and six children. Thomas at Walton; Nellie, wife of Seymour Shackelton of Cleaver; Gaza, wife of Paul Finch, Beerston road; Georgia, wife of Rev. Curtis Shoup of Callicoon; Colonel on the adjoining farm at Cleaver, and Mrs. Ethel Brundage at home; also two sisters, Mrs. John Gilbert of Bobs brook and Mrs. James Constable of Loomis. The funeral was held at his late residence Monday, conducted by Rev. George Evans, followed by interment in the family plot at Trout Creek.

Their son, Ethan (Sam), was born on Dec. 24, 1876. Annie returned home with her infant to live with her parents on a farm adjoining the Constable farm in Cleaver, on the Lower Loomis Brook Rd.

Annie and Aaron Phoenix were brother and sister. Kate Jane and Henry James Constable were brother and sister. It was common for a brother and a sister to marry a brother and a sister on a neighboring farm, to help insure the farms would stay in the family.

Annie and Aaron's father was John Harding Phoenix, a Calico Indian during the Delaware County Anti-Rent War in 1845. He's mentioned in Henry Christman's factual account of the event, "Tin Horns and Calico." He married Margaret Munson on May 13, 1847, after he was released from prison on the Governor's pardon. They lived in Andes before they married then moved to Cleaver where they lived for the remainder of their lives. They are buried in the Carroll Cemetery, Trout Creek. Margaret's maiden name is incorrectly 'davis' on their grave marker.

Annie and "Jim" lived in the house once owned by Ed Bailey, on Upper Loomis Brook Rd. Jim managed the Herm Henderson farm where the Peace Plantation is now located.

MORE: Annie was married, became a mother, and was widowed within one year at age 15! She was married to Grover Allen on December 24, 1875. He died of diphtheria sometime in 1876 before their son, Ethan Allen, was born on December 24, 1876. Her second marriage was to James Henry Constable on March 30, 1879. James Constable's sister Kate Constable married Aaron Phoenix on 25 Feb 1873. Aaron was Annie's brother. Brother and sister married brother and sister.

Notes for Jacob (Bodyne) Bodine

The assumption is that the Jacob Bodine who married Elizabeth Delameter is the same as the Jacob and Elizabeth Bodine who appear in the 1850 Census of Middletown, Delaware County, New York. That connection is not certain, but it is quite possible.

It is highly likely that this Jacob's parents were Francis Bodine and Margaret Sluyter. They had children baptized at the Kingston DRC (Dutch Reformed Church) in Ulster County, New York between 1768 and 1792. One of those was a Jacob Bodine. He was baptized on January 31, 1774. That date would approximately match the birth dates that this Jacob might have had. This Jacob's birth years according to the censuses he was in, range from 1770 to 1775. Jacob and Elizabeth (Delameter) Bodine had a son, Francis, baptized at the Kingston DRC in 1800.

Although this family often went by the surname Budine, there is some good evidence that this family did sometimes

And Moses' son, Marcus, was listed as Marcus Bodine in the 1880 Census of Walton, New York. Of course, the reporter or transcriber could have just incorrectly spelled their names, but maybe not.

Years ago Mother copied some information from the family Bible, but we don't know who has the Bible now. My mother's father was Malvin Beagle, brother of your grandmother, Mary Jane Beagle. Their father was John Beagle, who married Margaret Rifenburg. According to the family Bible, John's father was Moses Beagle, who was born in 1788. I found that there was a John Beagle in the Revolution who had a son named Moses, who was born in 1788. He also had a daughter Mary. Mother's sister, Mary Beagle, was named for your grandmother, Mary Jane Beagle. I believe that the John Beagle who was in the Revolution was our ancestor, but I haven't been able to find proof. I need proof that our great-grandfather, John Beagle, was the son of Moses Beagle.

According to what I have learned, the first John Beagle was born in Holland in 1745. He fought in the Revolution for 7 years, was at the battle of Trenton and at Yorktown when Lord Cornwallis was captured. He then returned to Fishkill, N.Y., where he married Winchie Van Nosedall. They had 10 children, moved to Troy, then to Schoharie. If you have any information about the Beagles, I would be very much interested to learn it.

Notes for Jean Bodin

FROM "DAVE'S BODINE GENEALOGY WEB SITE":

This Jean Bodin was born, it is said, in Medis, a village in the Canton of Saujon, District of Saintes, then located in the former French province of Saintonge, on May 9, 1645, based upon "a tradition universal in the family." This "traditional" statement is set forth by Mary Elisabeth Sinnott in her genealogical work, *Annals of the Sinnott, Rogers, Coffin, Corlies, Reeves, Bodine and Allied Families* (Philadelphia: J. B. Lippincott Co., 1905), p. 154. She does not state how this tradition came about. The year 1645 was noted earlier in E. P. Bodine's *History of the Branch of the Bodine Family Founded by Cornelius Bodine*, (Buffalo, 1897), p. 6 and in *Biographical, Genealogical and descriptive History of the First Congressional District of New Jersey* (New York: Lewis Publishing Company, 1900), ii, p. 283. The date May 9, 1645 was repeated, subsequent to Sinnott's publication, in *Genealogical and Memorial History of the State of New Jersey* (Lee, Francis Bazely, New York: Lewis Historical Publishing Company, 1910), iv, p. 1368, all of whom cited no references. No original source for this claim has yet been found. The location of his birth, Medis, appears to have some basis in fact. Upon having fled France, the French authorities noted his escape as "Boudin, fugitif de Medit, Election de Saintes" (Archives Nationales, Paris, TT No. 259).

Jean and Esther Bodin first removed to Soubize, a small village in the Canton of St. Agnant, District of Rochefort-sur-Mer. Accompanied by his wife, Esther, he fled his native country on Saturday, September 13, 1681, a date noted in the financial aid records of the Threadneedle Street Church in London. He arrived in Staten Island on 3 Nov 1677.

The arrival in America of Jean Bodin can be ascertained only by June 19, 1701, when Jean Bodin, as a resident of Middlesex County, in the Province of East Jersey, purchased an 80 acre tract of land on Staten Island, New York from Johannes and Neeltje Messereau. Middlesex County was situated just across Hudson Bay from Staten Island.

It would appear from probate records that Jean Bodin, now better known as John Bodine, died shortly before March 24, 1708. His death likely occurred shortly before January 3, 1708 when his will was noted in New York Calendar of Land Papers, iv (1704-1709), p. 81.

JEAN BOOTH: From data researched and compiled by Jean Booth, Jacksonville, FL (Jan 1984), from *Gen & Mem History of NJ*, Vol 4, P 1368; and *Bodine Family History*, p 260-9; and *Bodine Family History* by Stinnet, p 156:

Jean Bodine was born at Medis, France and removed to Rye, Sussex, England, where he resided for a short time prior to joining his father in Staten Island, New York on 3 Nov 1677. On 11 Jan 1680 in Flatbush, Kings Cnty, NY, He married Maria Crocheron, whose father John Crocheron was among the emigres to Staten Island. Issue: Isaac; Jacob; Peter; Abraham; Vincent. He married second Esther Bridon. Issue: Marianne; John (born Jan 23. 1681); Eleazar; Esther; Frances. Jean's death date is shown as 3 Jun 1707 (but Booth has a note that it may have been in 1694).

Notes for Jean Bodin

BOWDOIN COLLEGE: The following information is from a "Historical and Biographical Sketch of the Bowden, Bodine, Beaudoin, (Boden, Bodin, Bowdoin) Family," available at Bowdoin College, Brunswick, Maine. (George J. Mitchell Department of Special Collections & Archives).

The surnames Bowden, Bodine, Beaudoin including their many variations in spelling (Boden, Bodin, Bowdoin, etc.) are derived from the Baptismal Form meaning, "The Son of Baldwin". Another source states that the derivation is from a local name meaning "of Bowden", a parish in East Cheshire, England. Popularly and under French influence, the above surnames have been passed down to the present day. Changes of spelling of the surname even by members of the same family have been common. Consequently, the ancestor of a present day Boden might have spelled his name Bodine or Beaudoin. The Bodines (Bowdens) of New York, New Jersey, and of America have their origin in the Family of Le Boudin or De Boudain and the antiquity of the surname is attested by the French Charters of the twelfth Century. The family, Le Boudin was settled in Cambray, France, originally a district in the Low Countries as early as 1126.

Jean Bodine of the Cambray Family removed from Medis, in the Province of Saintonge, France to Holland and England, prior to emigrating to New York. He was a French Huguenot and was forced to flee France at this period of religious persecutions. He settled at Staten Island, at which place he had a survey of land April 1, 1686. Nothing is known of his wife or other children. Issue: Jean
