OBITUARY: Alma Duffield Ready, 95, died after a short illness on Thursday, May 29, 2003 at Holy Cross Hospital in Nogales, Arizona, where she has been a patient for the last few years.

Alma, an only child, was born in Cedarville, New Jersey on December 17, 1907 to Philip and Ada (Henderson) Duffield. At the age of 14 she was already an accomplished organist and once played for the church choir when it was invited to sing on the air 120 miles away at a Philadelphia radio station. Later, she graduated from New Jersey State College at Glassboro, where she studied to be a teacher and played the beautiful big concert piano at morning assemblies and for the Glee Club.

Years later, After the breakup of her first three marriages, Alma and her fourth (and last) husband Teddy moved to Arizona. She immediately fell in love with the state. She said, "To me the desert was a dream come true." After moving from Willcox to Oracle to Continental, they wound up in Tucson where both got jobs at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base. By now they were three; son Johnny had been born in 1946. Totally fascinated with the west, the family began exploring its beauty, venturing farther and farther on weekends and holidays. Johnny grew up as a prop in front of hundreds of photos. Eventually their long summer excursions became the pivot around which their lives revolved. Alma began carrying a camera and taking notes. She joined the Tucson Camera Club and began winning local photo contests.

Her first sale was to Arizona Highways Magazine. That article was followed by another and another and then she was commissioned to do several pieces for a forthcoming issue featuring Santa Cruz County. She also began a series of picture pages for the Arizona Republic's Sunday Magazine, "Days and Ways."

While trying to put together a portfolio of pictures of Santa Cruz County, which the family had explored so thoroughly, she learned from a Nogales librarian that, much to her surprise, the county's history had never been written. So, "to do the job right," she wrote, "I needed to live in Santa Cruz County!" By now, she had discovered that she liked to write.

In 1967 she leased an apartment in Nogales for a year and joined the local historical society. By now, son Johnny had graduated from high school in Tucson and Ted had no objections to her move. She also began a new job as Southern Arizona correspondent for the Arizona Republic, the state's largest newspaper. At the age of sixty she had started a new career, and continued writing for the paper for 14 years, approximately from 1967-1981.

It took her six years to finish the Santa Cruz County history, "Open Range and Hidden Silver." She also wrote "Calabasas: A True Story," "A Very Small Place: Arizona's Santa Cruz County Book List," and wrote and edited the "Nogales Arizona 1880-1980 Centennial Anniversary" book. All of them are available at the Pimeria Alta Historical Society, located in their museum on 136 North Grand Avenue in Nogales.

She attended classes in photography and conversational Spanish and became very active in the Pimeria Alta Historical Society. As Society president, she soon realized it needed a great deal of space for a museum. After learning that the old Nogales Town Hall was available, she ramrodded a successful effort to move in. Today it occupies the entire bottom floor. For two years she did a full-page photo feature each month for the local "Nogales International" newspaper.

Alma had many friends, and was a lover of art, music, poetry, and everything Arizona. She will be deeply missed by her family and the many people whose lives she has touched over the years. About Nogales she wrote: "I have been very happy here. The country is beautiful, the 'Border Culture' fascinating, the people friendly and the climate near-perfect. This is where I feel at home."

They say that home is where the heart is and Alma's heart indeed found a home in Nogales.

A memorial service will be held at 4:00 pm Saturday, June 21 at the Pimeria Alta Historical Society, located in their museum on 136 North Grand Avenue in Nogales.

Alma was preceded in death by her husband Ted, who passed away in 1986, and her son, James E. Simpson, who died in 1968. She is survived by three sons: Donald C. Flowers, of Novi, Michigan; Patrick D. Simpson, of Raleigh, North Carolina; and Johnny Ready, of Snellville, Georgia. She also leaves behind several grandchildren and great-grandchildren as well as a host of friends all over Arizona.

Mr. Budine also received a summons for an unsafe turn which is returnable before Town of Afton Justice Arthur Grover. State police at Sidney said that Mr. Budine was heading east when he attempted to make a left turn just as the rig operated by Earl B. Steele, Clayton, attempted to pass. The tractor-trailer was forced into the guardrails and the Budine car went into a ditch.

LEATHERCRAFT: Walton Reporter, January 1972: Leathercraft Work All Began With a Play Kit. A series of mishaps in his life set Gerdon Budine of Unadilla RD 1 on a course which gave him a new hobby and now a major vocation. Their hobby actually started for the Budines in 1969 when Mr. Budine was laid up for a few months with Meniere is disease, an ailment affecting the balancing factor of the inner ear. Their daughter, Kay Roof of Sidney Center, bought him a beginner's kit for leather working. On Jan. 28, 1970, Mr. Budine and his wife, Anne, suffered serious injuries in a traffic accident in Afton vicinity which yielded both of them with broken backs. There followed long.....

At first he shunned the kit with the objection that he is ¿no artist.¿ But because she cared enough to get it for him he broke into it one day and became a captive artisan. Today Mr. Budine works in leather craft every chance he gets, and with his wife operates Anne¿s Gift Shop on the Walton-Sidney road near Sidney Center in a small trailer where is also located his tiny workshop. He sounds like a cowboy when he talks about ¿pounding leather¿ but that¿s what it amounts to when Gerdon Budine takes a piece of leather, punch and hammer and starts to fashion a handbag or billfold. Anne assists by working with other offerings of the shop--belts, suede leather articles, decorative items. She also does the lacing on the products of her husband¿s bench.

Recently, a reporter; sattention was drawn to a handbag which had been crafted from leather. It featured a picture of the former Leslie Budine store and filling station once located the corner of Route 10 and the Bob; s Brook road. It was more realistic than the snapshot from which it was taken because this was Gerdon Budine; s home ground many years ago.

The Budines find that their hobby not only brings in extra income but it leads to new friendships at the art shows they attend. Next year they plan to do some traveling while the one child remaining at home is in Europe. Along with them, naturally, will be a supply of leather articles.

Customers occasionally have strange requests. One wife had ¿My love to you, honey¿ stenciled inside a billfold, Another person in the business of raising goats had a goat placed on his billfold; another person not at all related to the first one also requested the goat picture.

He put a picture of a Franklin church on a key case and a member of the church snapped it up almost before it was completed. Some of the customers include work associates in Department 29 at The Bendix Corporation in Sidney, where Mrs. Budine is also employed.

When seen the other day Mr. Budine was working on the first project he has undertaken for himself. His children gave him a mod type wineskin for Christmas. It has a leather surface so it will now have a new covering with pictures of deer and other animals embossed on it. The Christmas rush is over and he can afford to fool around a little with what started as a hobby performed by a reluctant hobbyist.



The new superintendents of highways, who were elected in the different towns of this county, took the oath of office within a day or two and on Thursday assumed their new duties, their terms of office beginning at once.

County superintendent of highways VanTassle is busy conferring with these officials in the various towns, and helping them to get started in their work.

Mr. VanTassle was in Walton Friday and Monday consulting with Leslie M. Budine, the new superintendent of highways in this town.

Mr. Budine already has several men at work opening ditches and cleaning out sluices in various parts of the town, preparatory for winter. As soon as the weather is more favorable he expects to employ many more men for a day or two each in this work, hoping to get the roads in good condition to stand the winter weather, and to afford proper drainage in the spring so as to avoid as much washing as possible.

Mr. Budine plans to make numerous changes in the system of working the roads in this town, but most of them will not be put into operation until spring, all that he can do now being to get the roads in as good shape as possible for winter, and to do the work as cheaply as he can.

MAN IN SHACK: From the Walton Reporter, date unknown...Walton Man Found Seriously Ill in Dilapidated Shack. Albert Howland, 72, Missing About Town, Found by Leslie Budine. Walton, Oct. 7.

In a dirty shack, which is in a most dilapidated condition, on Bob's Brook, Albert Howland, 72, was found by Leslie Budine lying on the floor in so weakened condition that he could not move. Mr. Budine had wondered at the whereabouts of Howland as he had not seen him in some time, so he made a special visit to the shack Thursday afternoon to see if he could locate him. The door was unlocked, and Howland, when he heard someone at the door, feebly called, 'Come in', so Budine walked in and found the man in an exhausted condition on the floor, where he had lain all day. Food was immediately furnished him and he was made as comfortable as possible. Dr. E. Ray Gladstone was called to the scene Friday afternoon. When he saw the conditions at the shack, he immediately contacted Frank Cadwood, local poor worker. Cadwood called the ambulance of A.J. Holmes & Co., and Howland was taken to the county farm at Delhi, where he will probably spend the winter.

Howland was exhausted because of the lack of food and being an old man, his strength soon gave way so it was impossible for him to call for help. Were it not for the thoughtfulness of Mr. Budine, Mr. Howland would probably have died alone."

Notes: HEART BALM: From the Walton Reporter, July 1, 1922: The case of Irene Lent versus Lawrence Budine to recover damages for alleged breach of promise, formerly slated for trial at this term of Delhi court, has been settled by mutual agreement without further litigation. The case grew out of an affair between Lawrence Budine of Walton, and Irene Lent of Cornwall-on Hudson. Lawrence, it is said, was bestowing, freely, his affections upon the receptive Miss Lent, with the ultimate result that a future marriage was arranged for by the two. At a later time and before the carrying out of former plans, Mr. Budine decided upon a change of affections and was accordingly married to Mrs. Hazel Lakin of Walton. Miss Lent, at hearing of this, at once arrived at the decision that nothing short of the payment of a few hundred dollars to her by Budine would possibly heal the heart wound caused by the alleged falsity of Budine. Suit was accordingly instituted and the case came to trial in Delhi court, where the jury decided that the proper heart balm was \$1700.50. The case was appealed and was coming into court on the present calendar, for the third time. But now the case is settled and Walton rejoices that her native son and prominent businessman is again free. Besides, four hundred dollars is somewhat different than \$1700.50.

Ever since I was a little girl and spent my summers in Walton, Archie was always there. He'd talk to all the kids; he'd show us his garden; he'd ask how we were doing with swimming lessons. Everyone was always fond of Archie. As the years passed and my visits to Walton became less frequent, Archie became more frail and moved very slowly. But he still had his garden every summer and he still loved to talk. We would usually see him walking very carefully over to his sister's house and he'd say hi if you called out loud enough for him to hear you. I didn't always see Archie every time I visited Walton these last few years, but it was comforting to know that he was still next door.

Archie died last Saturday. He'd been sitting outside, looking at his garden, and a little while later he quietly expired. He was 94 years old. He was the oldest person I had ever known. I didn't even know him well; he lived next door to my aunt and I spent my summers at her house as a child. I'll miss Archie. It already seems strange to think that he's not right next door like he always was."

The ceremonies of the occasion were entirely free from formality the couple mingling with the company and visiting until the time for the ceremony, when they took their places under the festoons of evergreens, arranged for the occasion, and were married. The Rev. L.H. Long, of Calicoon Depot, brother-in-law of the bride, was the officiating minister. After the ceremony a beautiful dinner was served and then the happy couple left on train 1 for a short wedding trip. In a few days Mr. and Mrs. Simpson will commence housekeeping in the house of D.R. Southard near the ME Church. Many presents were given the bride and groom and had among their money gifts amounts to quite a sum. Mr, Simpson is Sidney Centre's postmaster and is well known to Delaware County. Miss Youngs was one of Sidney Centre's most highly esteemed young ladies."

BERT'S LETTER: Letter from A.H. Simpson to his aunt Mary Jane (Simpson Beardsley) Moss in Oregon, undated: "I am still the Postmaster here which takes up part of my time. Mary helps me in the office and we have a boy that helps nights and mornings and goes to school. I can just remember you as you looked the night you started west a good many years ago - Frankie and I were small then - Now we will soon be old folks if we live. I wish we could see you all and some time I intend to come to the Coast - but we can't go anywhere now on account of the Post Office. How are all my cousins getting along? Write me all about them what their business is and how many children they have and everything. I remember soon after Frankie was married we heard her husband had very poor health - Has he gotten all strong? Did any of you get a chance to see the President in his recent trip to the West? I have seen him once. We had strawberry shortcake for dinner today and will have one for tomorrow - but the berries were not grown here - they came from the south. Ours will be ripe in about 10 days. Write soon. Your nephew, A.H. Simpson"

Tri-Town News, 1934: Mrs. Sarah J. Shaw, widow of the late Edward S. Shaw, passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. J.C. Simpson in this village, Saturday night after an illness of about nine weeks, at the age of 85 years, she having been born September 13, 1849.

Mrs. Shaw was born at Sidney Center, the daughter of James and Mary Patrick. She was married to Edward Shaw, September 5, 1867 and to them were born three daughters, Ida B. Benedict of Sidney Center, Rosamond Hoyt, deceased, and Mary A. Simpson of this village. Mr. Shaw died at their home in this village March 21, 1924. It was built on a hillside along the left fork of the Pines Brook road and was once used by the American Welfare League. Nathan¿s son, Harland, lived just down the road. It was said Nathan saw a barn like it ¿out west¿ and decided to build one on his farm at the head of Pines Brook. It was bought by Werner and Heinz Schiipel in 1954 after being employed at the farm since 1943.

Walton Reporter, Walton, N.Y. June 11, 1975: The Martins' unique round barn was the subject of a book of which only a few copies remain, according to Delaware County Historian H. Fletcher Davidson of Bovina Center, who said he believed it had been built by someone named McCrory. Werner and Heinz Schippel's barn is on a hillside along the left fork of Pines brook road, it was built by Nathan Budine whose son, Harlan, lives not far down the road and was used at one time by the American Welfare league. Mr. Budine had seen such a barn in use ¿out west; and decided to build one like it, it is said. The Schiippel brothers, whose father was a German immigrant, bought the farm (¿We got a good deal, ¿ say Heinz and Werner) in 1954 after having been employed there since 1943. It has its advantages and disadvantages, they relate. The mow is cooler than that of conventional barns. A cupola at the top of the barn which is some 80 feet above the main floor level provides superior ventilation. It poses a problem with bales, however, due to its shape, ¿It would be ideal for loose, hay and would allow more to be stacked in that manner than in your square barns, it notes Heinz. It would he suitable for horses, the brothers feel, and has during its existence been used for just that purpose. But they strictly use it as a dairy barn at present. They have 70 head of cattle, of which 56 are milkers. Stanchions are set up as in a conventional barn but, says Werner, ¿You don; t have to walk so far.; ¿We had to build corners on so we could straighten out the gutters,; Heinz remarks, cotherwise they froze up on us during the winter."

Walton Reporter 4 October 2000 headline reads: "100-Year-Old Pines Brook Round Barn Collapses [Friday, 29 Sep 2000]."

OBITUARY: Found Dead in Bed...Nathan Budine, Pines Brook Farmer, Dies Wednesday. Nathan Budine of Pines Brook in the town of Walton was found dead in bed Wednesday morning. Mr. Budine on retiring Tuesday night appeared to be in good health. Wednesday morning when Mrs. Budine awoke she found that Mr. Budine, who was an early riser, had not built the fires or tended to the chores as was his custom. She went to his room and found that he had passed away during the night. Mr. Budine, who was 59 years of age, had spent his entire life on Pines Brook, where he had the respect and friendship of all in that neighborhood. Thirty-six years ago he was united in marriage to Miss Julia Christian. Three children were born to this union, two of whom, Rufus and Harland, survive; another son, Nathan, died several years ago.

60TH ANNIVERSARY: Walton Reporter, 3/31/1939: Thursday, March 30, Mr. and Mrs. James Constable, who live on the Loomis-Northfield road near Loomis, celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary at the home of their daughter and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. Herman Budine. Mr. and Mrs. Budine were married at Cannonsville March 30, 1879, by Rev. W.W. Wetmore at the parsonage of his church. Four generations of the family were represented, Mr. Constable, 86, being the oldest present, and his great grandchild, three months-old Evelyn Ann Yarnes, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Yarnes, Walton, the youngest.

Annie Phoenix was married (first) to Grover Allen, Dec. 24, 1875, when she was only 14 years old. He died of diphtheria sometime during the Spring/ Summer/Fall of 1876. Annie and Aaron Phoenix were brother and sister. Kate Jane and Henry Jemes Constable were brother and sister. It was common for a brother and a sister to marry a brother and a sister on a neighboring farm, to help insure the farms

Annie and Aaron¿s father was John Harding Phoenix, a Calico Indian during the Delaware County Anti-Rent War in 1845. He¿s mentioned in Henry Christman's factual account of the event, ¿Tin Horns and Calico.¿ He married Margaret Munson on May 13, 1847, after he was released from prison on the Governor¿s pardon. They lived in Andes before they married then moved to Cleaver where they lived for the remainder of their lives. They are buried in the Carroll Cemetery, Trout Creek. Margaret¿s maiden name is incorrectly ¿Davis¿ on their grave marker.

Annie and ¿Jim¿ lived in the house once owned by Ed Bailey, on Upper Loomis Brook Rd. Jim managed the Herm Henderson farm where the Peace Plantation is now located.

BIOGRAPHY: William A. Potts was born in Washington, North Carolina in 1827 and died in Savannah, Georgia, 15 Dec 1900. After his marriage in New Bern, NC, he continued to live in Washington, where he was engaged in naval stores operations, manufactured turpentine and operated a line of sailing vessels to the West Indies. His death took place while he was on a visit to Savannah. Never a politician, he always, however, gave the Democratic Party a warm support. From his youth up a member of the Presbyterian Church of Washington, for many years he was one of the elders, and was the main pillar of it. In Masonry he maintained membership with Orr Lodge no. 104, A.F. and A.M., of Washington, and he was a past master of the lodge. He married Josephine Latham in New Bern, NC. She was born there in 1830 and died in Washington, North Carolina, in May, 1895. Their children were as follows: Lucy, William Jr., Joseph, Lida (died in infancy), Hannah (died in infancy), Ida, John R., Zophar Mills, Frederick and Nets (Nedia).

CENSUS: 1860 US Census: W.A. Potts, age 33 was a merchant with personal property valued at 20M. He lived with wife, Josephine, age 27, and children: Susan(?), age 9; Joseph, age 8; William, age 6; Julia, age 4; and Eliza, age 2. Joseph, Julia and Eliza were not counted in the next 2 censuses (1870 and 1880) and may have died young.

1870 US Census: William and Josephine lived next door to his father and mother, Joseph and Annie. Their four listed children, all born in NC, were: Suzy L., age 18; W.A. Potts Jr., age 15; Ida, age 5; and John R., age 2.

1900 US Census: William Potts, age 72, was living with his daughter Lucy, age 48 and son-in-law Frederick A. Hanks, age 48.

CENSUS DATA: William H. Morgan and family were counted in the 1920 U.S. census on January 30th as living on 5th Street in the city of Washington, Beaufort County, NC. They are listed in Volume 7, line 28, Supervisor's district 11, Enumeration district 17, sheet 9.

William owned his home (mortgaged) and was age 64. He and his parents were all born in NC. He worked on his "own account" as a dealer in the retail grocery business. At the time, he lived with wife, Wilmoth, age 55, and son William H., age 28, who worked as a manager in a tobacco company. Also living in the home were son Franklin J., age 33, a post office clerk, his wife Myrtle R.,age 23, and their children Myrtle W., age 2, and Frances D., 7 months old.

Notes for William Simpson

BIO AND CENSUS: Just to the north of Sand Hill lay the town of Butternuts. Its name was derived from three butternut trees growing from one stump, which marked the corner of the three towns of Pittsfield, New Lisbon and Butternuts. On the ¿first Sabbath¿ of January, 1839, according to records of the Presbyterian Church (formerly First Congregational) in the village of Butternuts (now Gilbertsville), Mary Jane¿s parents, former Methodists William Simpson and his wife (Lavinia) were received ¿by examination¿ into the church. William was baptized that day and four months later, on May 5, 1839, William¿s two-month-old daughter, Mary Jane Simpson, was also baptized.

1840 US census: lists William Simpson living in Butternut, Delaware County, NY State. With him were two sons and one daughter under 5, and 1 daughter age 5-10. William and his wife were between ages 20-30.

By 1850 they had moved a few miles southeast down Otsdawa Creek; s west branch in the town of Otego. In 1850, Living together were: William Simpson (38), Lovinia (39), Jane (11), Harriet (9). Lewis (8) and Helen (6).

By 1855 they had moved again, this time southwest to a 132-acre farm across the Susquehanna River into Delaware County. Sixteen-year-old Mary Jane and her family now lived in Maplefront (now Youngs Station), an area halfway between the villages of Sidney Plains (now Sidney) and Sidney Center. They owned a 132-acre farm near Carrs Creek.

1860 US census: records for 1860 indicate William was a 47 year old farmer with real estate valued at \$1500 and personal assets of \$176. His tombstone says he was age 81. Still at home on August 10, 1860 were wife Lavinia, age 48; Lewis, age 18; Helen, age 16; and Alvina, age 3.

William's son, Lewis Simpson, died 1 May 1863 from injuries in the Civil War.

Another son, Justus, left home 14 April 1865 [the day Lincoln was shot], for Kankakee, Illinois.

Around 1867, William deserted his wife and moved to Western New York State.

In the 1880 US Census, William Simpson is listed on page 29, Supervisor¿s Dist. No. 9, Enumeration Dist. No. 162 as living in Campbell, Steuben County, N.Y. He is a W M age 68, living with wife Sarah W F 60, and 2 stepsons: George Grimes (22) and Charles Grimes (17). George ¿works on farm; and Charles was ¿at school.¿

After the death of Lewis¿s mother Lovinia (nee Youngs, William¿s first wife) in 1890, William tried to claim his son¿s military pension. The affidavits describe him as having deserted his Sidney Center, NY family in 1867 and later turning up in Campbell, NY. He was also described as very poor.

The 1860 US census lists Sarah Grimes, age 44 as being born about 1816 in New York State. In 1860 she was living in Bradford, Steuben, New York. Her husband was Norman Grimes, 44, and she had a son George, age 2. At the time she had 7 other children: Philander, Mary Jane, Julia, Daniel, Morran, Orrin, & Lucy. Son Charles would not have been born yet.

The 1870 US census lists Lavinia (not Lovinia) as age 58, living with son George and daughter-in-law Martha at their home in the town of Masonville, Delaware Co., NY. From a letter dated 19 Feb 1890, Sidney Center, NY, written by daughter Allie: "Mother died Saturday evening at half past 7 o'clock and was buried here to the Center yesterday the 18 of Feb." Her tombstone says she died 15 Feb 1890 age 77 years 8 months 1 day. It also says, "Heaven is my home at last.;

Notes: BIOGRAPHY: All the honor that belongs to the high-minded, public-spirited citizen belongs of right to Justus L. Simpson, of Francesville, Indiana, but it is as a soldier that Mr. Simpson has the strongest claim on the admiration of his fellow citizens. He is not only a soldier, but the grandson of a soldier, and his service in the war of the states in behalf of the Union was so heroic and his sufferings were so great that his military experience was exceptional in many ways.

Mr. Simpson was born on a farm near Gilbertsville, Otsego County, New York, May 16, 1837, a son of William and Lovina (Young) Simpson. His father's father did gallant service in the war of 1813-14. Records of other wars in America and in England bear the name of Simpson so prominently that there can be no question that Justus L. Simpson inherited the military instinct and predilection in an unusual degree.

August 30, 1862, when he was a little past twenty-five years old, he enlisted at Gilbertsville, New York, as a private in Company G, One Hundred and Fifty-second Regiment, New York Volunteer Infantry, to serve three years or during the war. He served until honorably discharged, February 4, 1865, on account of wounds received in a charge in the battle of Hanover Court House, Virginia. He participated in a charge on the rebel works at the battle of Suffolk, Virginia, and in the Wilderness campaign he was under constant fire for twenty-two days, from May 2 to May 24, 1864.

The principal battles of this series were those of the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, North Anna Court House and Hanover Court House. In the last named engagement he was shot, May 24, 1864, under the following interesting circumstances: His regiment was deployed for service on the skirmish line. After twenty-four hours' arduous service it was relieved and sent to the rear among the reserves, but was almost at once called upon to relieve a regiment which had exhausted its ammunition, and took its place on the firing line in the woods, where it was under direct and galling fire in front of the enemy. The soldiers availed themselves of such shelter as trees offered, and Comrade Simpson gained the slight protection of the tree, whose trunk was about six inches in diameter. He was on his knees, loading his musket, when he found that a rebel sharpshooter had him in range. One shot struck the tree directly in front and in range of his forehead, and a second and a third shot narrowly missed him. A lieutenant standing about a rod in his rear cautioned him to look out as a sharpshooter had located him. As many as nine or ten shots came close to him, and soon he was struck, the ball passing through the flesh of the upper part of the left leg, and through the right leg, cutting off the leaders and making a fearful wound. Comrade Simpson attempted to gain the shelter of a large tree a little distance in the rear, but found he could not walk. The lieutenant ordered two men to take him to the shelter of the tree. There he fainted, and, according to his vivid imagination, beautiful flowers, trees and fine white houses appeared to him with remarkable distinctness and minuteness. This pleasing illusion was followed by loud noises and great distress. Still unconscious, he was carried to the rear in a rubber blanket by four comrades, who finally procured a stretcher, and he was taken to the field hospital, about two and a half miles from the place where he was shot. His wound was dressed, and he lay in the hospital until next day, when he was taken to the Potomac River and by steamboat to Washington, where he was placed in the Columbia College Hospital, and remained until about August 20, when he was transferred to Philadelphia and placed in Judicial Square Hospital. Gangrene in his wounds set in soon after, and then he fully expected death from day to day. The physician at Judicial Square Hospital told him he had but one chance for his life, and that was at Turner Lane Hospital. He was so weak that he was removed only with great difficulty, stimulated by four ounces of brandy. Here Dr. King, of Pottsville, Pennsylvania, was his physician. This very skillful surgeon removed the mortified flesh with much difficulty by repeated burnings. The operation was a terrible one, and it is impossible to realize Mr. Simpson's sufferings. The flesh was eaten away until he could have put his hand into the wound. His brother George visited him in September, 1864, and when he first saw him thought he was dead, so deathly was his appearance and so awful his condition of emaciation and weakness as he lay for fresh air under a tent. The patient did not know his brother. Mr. Simpson feels that he owes his life to Dr. King, to the Sanitary Commission, and to benevolent ladies who came every day to visit the sick and bring them flowers and delicacies.

Until wounded Comrade Simpson was always an active soldier, and was in all the campaigns, marches, battles and skirmishes in which his regiment took part, and was prompt and cheerful in the discharge of all his duties. He received a severe sunstroke in 1863, and still feels the effects of it. He was then on a forced march, but did not leave his regiment. He left his home in New York State, April 14, 1865 [the day Lincoln was shot], for Illinois, and went directly to Kankakee. After a short visit he went to Iroquois county, Illinois, as a cattle-herder, and remained there one year. As he rode a horse he could do this kind of work, but was very lame, and could not get his heel to the ground for two years after he left the service. For two years afterward he was overseer for the firm of Milk, Bancroft & Serring on a farm of six hundred and fifty acres, all planted in corn. Later, and until 1871, he managed another large farm. Meantime, December 22, 1868, he had married, at Kankakee, Illinois, Susan E. Clemans, a native of Wayne County, New York, and a daughter of Lorenzo and Sarah (Kelly) Clemans.

Lorenzo Clemans was born in Wayne County, New York, in a house which had been built in the pioneer days by his father, Dr. Asaph Clemans. Dr. Clemans, whose mother was a sister of General Israel Putnam, of Revolutionary fame, was of Puritan stock and married Orpha Ives, a daughter of

Moses Ives, who was a Revolutionary soldier from Connecticut. They had children named Moses, Asaph, Rensselaer, Putney, Nancy, Clarissa, Polly and Susannah. The Doctor, who took his medical degree in Rochester, New York, was in his day a distinguished physician and a man of much property, who acquired a considerable landed estate, most of which is now owned by his descendants. In political faith he was for many years an old-line Whig. He was one of the organizers of the Republican Party and voted for Fremont and for Lincoln. He was an active member of the Methodist church and a class-leader in his organization, and died aged seventy-two, after a busy and useful life. Lorenzo Clemans, son of Asaph Clemans and father of Mrs. Simpson, was born about 1818, and died aged seventy-eight. He was a successful farmer and married Sarah Kelly, a native of Oneida County, New York. The family of Kelly is prominent in New York, especially in Buffalo, and Mrs. Lorenzo Clemans; sister, Mary, married a general of the Confederate army.

Mrs. Clemans had two brothers, named Joseph and Ezekiel. The children of Mr. and Mrs. Clemans were named Oscar, Lydia, Orson, Susan E., Ann, Colista, Rensselaer and George. Oscar, who was a member of a New York infantry regiment, died the death of a soldier during the civil war.

In 1875 Justus L. Simpson removed, with his wife, to Newton County, Indiana, and managed a cattle ranch for Lemuel Milk, of Kankakee, Illinois, until 1876, when he bought his present farm in Salem Township, which was known as the old Nathaniel Waple farm. He has lived on this place since 1876, and has improved it by drainage and by the erection of new buildings. His residence, in the midst of a beautiful grove, is one of the most tasteful and attractive in this part of the county, and the hospitality dispensed under its roof is as generous as it is spontaneous. To Mr. and Mrs. Simpson have been born five children: Jennie A., Cora M., Romeo, Jessie Ray and Sherrie. Romeo died in infancy; the others survive. Jennie A. and Cora M. became well known school-teachers. The former taught at Francesville and at other points in Pulaski county for nine years and is now the wife of William Bechdolt, of Oregon. Cora M. has had an experience of ten years in the public schools and is now teaching in the high school in Salem Township. She attended the normal school at Valparaiso, Indiana, and Terre Haute state normal. Jessie Ray lives in Oregon, and Sherrie on the home farm. Mrs. Simpson and her daughters are members of the Christian church. Comrade Simpson is a Grand Army man and a good Republican. While a resident of Newton County he served the people of McClellan Township as assessor and as trustee. He is influential in his part of the county, because those who know him have confidence in his integrity and good judgment.

HISTORY: (Newton Co., IN Biography: Newton County, McClellan Township. From A History of Warren, Benton, Jasper & Newton Counties, 1883): Justus L. Simpson was born in Otsego County, New York, May 16, 1837. He is one of seven children of William and Lovina A. (Young) Simpson, natives of New York. He received his education in the common schools of his native state. At the age of ten, he was adopted by S. Platt, with whom he lived until twenty-one.

He then worked by the month until 1862, when he enlisted in Company G, One Hundred and Fifty-second New York Volunteer Infantry, and served with the regiment until discharged February 24, 1865. He participated in all marches of his regiment, being under Gen. Dix at the siege of Suffolk in the Peninsular campaign. During the New York riots, his regiment was ordered out, after which they were transferred to the Army of the Potomac, under Gen. Grant. He was at the battles of the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, and, while charging the enemy's works at Hanover Court House, received a gunshot wound in the leg, which laid him up eighteen months, and from the effects of which he has never entirely recovered.

On December 22, 1868, Justus married, at Kankakee, Illinois, Susan E. Clemans, of Wayne County, New York, the daughter of Lorenzo D. and Sarah (Kelly) Clemens. Four children were been born to them, three of whom, Jennie A., Cora M. and Jesse R., survived. Romeo died in infancy. In 1875, Mr. Simpson came to McClellan Township, Newton County, Indiana, where he has since managed a cattle ranch for Lemuel Milk. It consists of 3,000 acres, upon which are several hundred cattle. In politics, Mr. Simpson is Republican, and one of the foremost men of the township.

HEPPNER: (Heppner Herald, May 21, 1915) J.L. Simpson honored on his 78th Birthday. Last Sunday was a happy day for Mr. J.L. Simpson and one which he will remember the rest of his life. On that day was celebrated his 78th birthday and a number of his relatives gathered at the beautiful Simpson home in west Heppner and observed this event in a fitting manner. One of the treats of the day was the three-course dinner which was prepared by his able and loving wife. During the day Mr. and Mrs. Simpson were often called upon to relate stories of their early life and struggles back in their old home in New York and Indiana and it is not amiss here to give a brief account of the lives of these

two well known people who have lived in Heppner for the past eight years and who have made a wide circle of friends and have been agents for good in the community.

"Mr. Simpson was born in Otsego County, New York, in the year 1837. His father was a soldier in the War of 1812 and the son also served his country during the terrible Civil War and was mustered out in 1865 on account of wounds received in the battle of Hanover Court House, Virginia. After the war he went to Illinois and there met Miss Susan E. Clemans and the two young people were married in the year 1868. Mrs. Simpson's parents were likewise descendants of men and women who had been prominently identified with the early history of this country.

In 1875 they moved to Indiana where they lived until they came to Oregon several years ago. For some time they lived at Milton and then came to Heppner. They enjoy excellent health here and have one of the most attractive homes in our city.

Among those present at Mr. Simpson's birthday celebration were Mrs. J.M. Moss of Milton, a sister; Mr. and Mrs. William Frazier of Milton, the latter being a niece of Mr. Simpson; Mr. and Mrs. W.W. Bechdolt and two children of Hardman, Mrs. Bechdolt being a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Simpson. The Herald joins with their friends in hoping that they will live to enjoy many such events as the one just mentioned."

Justus was a member of the N.Y. Volunteer Infantry in the Civil War and was wounded in the battle of Hanover Court House, Virginia. He was mustered out because of his wounds in 1865. He married Susan E. Clemans of the Clemans family of Illinois, Heppner Pioneers in 1868 and moved to Indiana in 1875. He moved to Milton, Oregon in 1905 and to Heppner, Oregon in 1907 where he died July 2, 1917. He was buried in the Heppner cemetery on the 4th of July, 1917 at the age of 80.

According to material from the Frazier Farmstead Museum in Milton-Freewater, Oregon, he had 2 daughters and 2 sons. One (unnamed) daughter married W. W. (J.) Bechdolt in Hardman, Oregon (now a ghost town). Daughter Cora May married E.J. Merrill, also from Hardman. Son J.R. (Jessie Ray?) Simpson lived in Monon, Indiana. Son S.A. Simpson (Sherry) lived in Medaryville, Indiana. Justus died a member of the GAR and the Christian Church in Heppner, Oregon.

(Heppner Herald, Friday, July 6, 1917) J.L. Simpson, an aged and highly respected resident of Heppner passed away at his home here Monday, July 2, aged 80 years. Deceased was a native of New York state and lived for a time in Indiana before coming to Oregon 12 yearsago. The family first settled at Milton, remaining there two years, removing to Heppner ten years ago.

He was a veteran of the civil war being a member of the New York Volunteer Infantry. He was an honored member of the G.A.R. and of the Christian church. He is survived by a widow and four children. The children are: Mrs. J. Bechdolt and Mrs. E.J. Merrill, of Hardman, J.R. Simpson, of Monon, Ind., and S.A. Simpson, of Medaryville, Ind. A brother and sister in New York state and a sister at Milton, Oregon, also survive him. Funeral services were held in the Christian church Wednesday July 4, at 9:30 a.m., internment being in Heppner cemetery.

BUTTERNUTS: The town of Morris was originated from Butternuts April 6, 1849. The town of Butternuts, with which Morris was connected, derives its name from three butternut trees growing from one stump, which marked the corner of the three towns of Pittsfield, New Lisbon and Butternuts. This village was first called Louisville, in honor of Louis, brother of Paschal Franchot; but trouble having been produced by Louisville wishing to be separated from Butternuts, the dispute was finally settled by giving it the name of Morris, in honor of Gen. Jacob Morris. During the decade 1830-1840, Morris passed through its "stone age," according to an article in the Morris Chronicle in 1917. Five large stone buildings were built, including the Gardner hotel (later Morris Inn).

On September 14, 1862 Lewis received a wound in the left knee by a mini ball at the battle of South Mountain in Maryland (Fox's Gap). Because of this wound, Lewis's left leg was amputated just above the knee at the United States Hospital in Maryland, on or about September 17, 1862. On February 5, 1863, Lewis L. Simpson received a Certificate of Disability for Discharge. Five days later, in Washington, D.C., he applied for a Pension.

Lewis returned home and died in May 1, 1863. There may have been contributory negligence on his part causing the necessity for a second amputation, and consequently the fatal result. There may have been surgical malpractice in the case. Lewis had never married nor were there any children. He was buried in the Methodist church cemetery in Sand Hill, New York, a tiny settlement near Wells Bridge, New York. Both military and pension records exist for Lewis as his mother later applied for his pension. When she died her estranged husband (William Simpson) also applied.

1857 POORHOUSE INVESTIGATION: This is a two-story house of wood, very old and

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dilapidated, thirty by forty feet. Beside this is an asylum twenty-five by thirty feet. Attached is a farm of one hundred and seventy-five acres yielding a revenue of \$250.00. The basements are used only for the storage of produce. In the house are twelve rooms heated by stoves and furnaces, destitute of ventilation and with extremely low ceilings. The number of inmates was fifty-eight; twenty-five males and thirty-three females; of these two-thirds are native and one-third foreign born; eleven are under sixteen years of age. The sexes are kept separate. They are under one keeper assisted by his wife. From two to twelve paupers are placed in a single room. The average number of inmates is sixty-five; supported at an average weekly cost of one dollar. The able males are employed on the farm and the women about the house. Once during the year past the supervisors have visited the house. It is supplied with Bibles, and there are occasional religious services; the children are sent to the district school. The superintendent procures supplies for the house, and prescribes rules and regulations concerning government and system of diet. He also binds out the children and exercises the power of discharging lunatics. A physician is employed by the year, who visits the house when called. There are no arrangements for bathing and no water for the house except what is drawn from the river. They have a well, which is now (August 16,) dry. During the year have occurred seven deaths.

Of the inmates, thirteen are lunatics; three males, ten females, all except one are paupers. For the reception of lunatics is erected another and separate building, in size twenty-five by thirty feet. In this are fourteen cells, close and without means of light or ventilation, except by a small diamond hole in the door. The inmates sleep on straw changed once a week. Two are confined in these cells the whole time and all at night. They have no special medical or other attendance. Sometimes they are restrained by handcuffs. The keeper reports two as improved and three cured during the year; but the committee fails to discover how improvement or cures can be effected with the facilities here offered. Eight of the paupers are idiots; five males, three females. There is one deaf and dumb.

NOTES TAKEN BY ROBERT E. BUDINE, OMAHA, NEBRASKA:

Moses Budine 1806-1893 was the second son of Jacob Bodine (Jr.) and Hilletjie Clover. Jacob Bodine born about 1770 was the son of Jacob Bodine (Sr.) and Elizabeth Newkirk. (The Jr. and Sr. designations are presumptions at this point.) As of May 1998 we had not positively determined how or when the spelling of Moses; last name was changed from Bodine to Budine. There is a possibility the change occurred during a census and was never corrected for spelling nor pronunciation. Another and more interesting possibility, handed down through the Herman Budine branch (Bruce), is that Moses, aunt became angry with the rest of the family and had his last name legally changed. Moses Budine died in Walton, NY Dec 14, 1893 at age 87 of bronchial consumption (old age). He is buried in Walton Cemetery in the lower section back of the Asa Budine lot.

CENSUSES:

1810 Census: He's probably one of three males under 10 in the 1810 Delaware Co., NY Census.

1850 Census: Moses and Catherine had 6 sons and 5 daughters all living in their household at Andes, NY where they had moved in 1849. Catherine and Moses were cousins. In the 1850 Census, Moses was spelled ¿Meosis.; In an 1855 Census his last name was spelled ¿Bodine.;

1855 NY State Census: Moses and family are listed as living in Andes, District 1, family 43. Mrs. Robert Burghart could find no record of wife Catherine's death.

1880 Census: In Hancock, Delaware Co., NY, there is a Moses (73), Alvira (44), Edd (19), and John Bodine (40) in one house.

In the 1880 Census of Hancock, Delaware Co., NY, there is a Moses (73), Alvira (44), Edd (19), and John Bodine (40) in one house. In the 1900 Census of Hancock, Alvira is listed as John's stepmother. Alvira must have married Moses, John's father, when she was relatively young as compared to Moses. Here we see the name going back and forth between Budine and Bodine. This would lend credence to the idea that the name Budine may have started out as Bodine.

ANTI-RENT WAR: From the American Encyclopedia: Anti-rent Movement, a political protest against the semi-manorial system of land tenures in New York state. It began in Albany in 1839 and spread throughout the central part of the state. In the 17th century the Dutch and the English had granted large tracts of public land to the Van

Rensselaer, Livingston, and other families. The land had then been leased to tenant farmers, who paid annual rents and taxes, owed feudal obligations, and had no rights to mines or mill sites. This system continued well into the 19th century, but, by the 1830's, Hudson Valley farmers believed that the leaseholds were a direct violation of the Declaration of Independence. It was time, they felt, to abolish slavery, promote temperance, and end an economic system that relegated them to being semi-serfs.

The event that catalyzed the anti-rent agitation was the death of Stephen Van Rensselaer, the landlord of a large estate in Albany and Rensselaer counties. His will instructed his two heirs to collect \$400,000 in back rent in order to balance outstanding debts, but their attempts to obey the injunction met with resistance and promoted similar demonstrations on neighboring estates. The anti-renters, dressed as Indians, resisted state militia units and tarred and feathered hostile sheriffs. A high pitch of violence was reached on August 7, 1845, when Deputy Sheriff Osman Steele was killed in Delaware County. Governor Silas Wright declared a state of insurrection. More than 50 men were tried and convicted, and two of them received life sentences for their actions.

The campaign of violence had failed, but the anti-rent movement was not ended. Both the Whigs and the Democrats recognized the value of farmer support. In June 1846 the state constitutional convention, meeting in Albany, abolished manorial obligations and limited leases to 12 years. In the subsequent gubernatorial election, Whig candidate John Young, with anti-rent endorsements, defeated incumbent Wright. Young redeemed his campaign promises, pardoning the participants in the Steele murder and directing his attorney general to institute proceedings against defective titles. The great estates were being gradually divided, and the ballot box, not tar and feathers, led to the anti-rent victory.

James Fenimore Cooper described incidents in the anti-rent movement from a conservative position in "The Littlepage Manuscripts", a trilogy consisting of the novels "Satanstoe" (1845), "The Chainbearer" (1845), and "The Redskins" (1846).

OBITUARY: Walton Reporter, Dec 1908: Was in Anti-Rent War and Later Fought for the Union in Civil War--John Phoenix Dies at Ripe Age of 90 Years. John Phoenix died at his home at Cleaver Dec. 19th, in his 90th year. Deceased was born at Cabin Hill July 27, 1819, town of Andes, where his father, one of the early settlers of the county, had moved to as early as 1794 and settled on a farm. He grew up with the county and was a rugged, healthy man up to a few weeks before his death. He participated in the anti-rent riots during the early 40's and was one of the band who were brought to Delhi jail for the shooting of Deputy Sheriff Osmond Steel and with the rest of the party was confined for a time [in Dannemora State Prison] and afterwards pardoned by Gov. Young. Shortly after being pardoned he married Margaret Munson, who died 9 years ago. From that union he leaves behind him to mourn his loss 4 children, 28 grandchildren, 22 great-grandchildren; a record to be proud of as a sturdy pioneer of Delaware county. On September 2, 1864, he enlisted as a Union private in the Civil War, being a member of Co. G, 144th N.Y.V.I., and was discharged 9 months and 23 days later on June 25, 1865 with chronic diarrhea. Shortly after the war or in 1870, he moved to the farm at Cleaver, (P.O. address, Loomis) then known as Loomis brook where he died. He was a hard working, industrious man and with his noble wife soon cleared up the place and had it one of the best paying farms in the valley. Born at a time when schools were few and land must be cleared, he did not have the advantages of an education but made sure his children should. He could neither read or write.

Since the death of his wife his son Aaron and wife have tenderly cared for him. The funeral was held at his late residence Tuesday, the 22nd, at 11a.m., conducted by the Rev. Gritman of Cannonsville. Interment in the family plot at Trout Creek cemetery. The children are Aaron, at home; Hannah, wife of John Gilbert; Estelle, wife of Aaron Franks; Annie, wife of James Constable. Cause of death was old age and an attack of heart trouble.

MISC: According to Marianne (McCaffrey) Greenfield, John was a prisoner in Andersonville during the Civil War and returned home with his hair turned completely white. Lucille Dewey's records indicate that he entered the Civil War Sep 1864 for 1 year as PVT in the 144th NYV. His age was listed as 43 born in Delaware County and married.

Notes for Margaret Emily Munson

OBITUARY: May have been Margaret Davis? Mrs. John Phoenix, who died at her home in Cleaver December 19, was born in Middletown, Delaware county, sixty-nine years ago. Her maiden name was Margaret Munson. She was married to Mr. Phoenix, or ¿Uncle John¿ as he is familiarly called, fifty-six years ago, and God¿s blessings have been upon them all those years. She was ever ready to lend a helping hand to the sick and afflicted, and not a boy or girl under twenty-five years of age for miles around but what were first fondly handled by her with few exceptions. In her girlhood days she waited for her John to return front the anti-rent war and in 1864, with her children around her, she again waited for her John to come home from the war. After the war they removed to Cleaver where she has since resided, surrounded by many friends and no enemies. She was only sick six days and quickly fell asleep without a struggle and without a pain.

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She leaves besides her husband one son, Aaron, and three daughters, Mrs. John Gilbert, Mrs. James Constable and Mrs. Aaron Franks, and several grandchildren. The funeral was largely attended at her late home on Friday. Rev. Jared Wells, of East Sidney, officiated. Interment at Trout Creek.

Mr. Phoenix was born in the town of Middletown 73 years ago and while yet a young man his parents, with their children, moved to the farm at Cleaver, where he died. Here he became acquainted with and afterwards married Kate Constable who lived on an adjoining farm. For some years after marriage he worked out around the neighborhood but some forty years ago he returned to his father's farm, putting his savings into the place, and spent the balance of his life's toil upon that farm.

Mr. Phoenix was a tireless worker, a man who knew not the meaning of the word rest. From sun to sun he was everlastingly working and all that time working for the welfare of his family, his only thought; honest, upright and faithful in all his dealings, he was one of the best liked men in that territory of the town of Tompkins. He had a keen interest in everything that went to make the town a success. A Republican in politics, he was no bigot. He could look over the fence and if satisfied he would not hesitate to support the opposition. Notes for John Harding Phoenix

ANTI-RENT WAR: From the American Encyclopedia: Anti-rent Movement, a political protest against the semi-manorial system of land tenures in New York state. It began in Albany in 1839 and spread throughout the central part of the state. In the 17th century the Dutch and the English had granted large tracts of public land to the Van Rensselaer, Livingston, and other families. The land had then been leased to tenant farmers, who paid annual rents and taxes, owed feudal obligations, and had no rights to mines or mill sites. This system continued well into the 19th century, but, by the 1830's, Hudson Valley farmers believed that the leaseholds were a direct violation of the Declaration of Independence. It was time, they felt, to abolish slavery, promote temperance, and end an economic system that relegated them to being semi-serfs.

The event that catalyzed the anti-rent agitation was the death of Stephen Van Rensselaer, the landlord of a large estate in Albany and Rensselaer counties. His will instructed his two heirs to collect \$400,000 in back rent in order to balance outstanding debts, but their attempts to obey the injunction met with resistance and promoted similar demonstrations on neighboring estates. The anti-renters, dressed as Indians, resisted state militia units and tarred and feathered hostile sheriffs. A high pitch of violence was reached on August 7, 1845, when Deputy Sheriff Osman Steele was killed in Delaware County. Governor Silas Wright declared a state of insurrection. More than 50 men were tried and convicted, and two of them received life sentences for their actions.

The campaign of violence had failed, but the anti-rent movement was not ended. Both the Whigs and the Democrats recognized the value of farmer support. In June 1846 the state constitutional convention, meeting in Albany, abolished manorial obligations and limited leases to 12 years. In the subsequent gubernatorial election, Whig candidate John Young, with anti-rent endorsements, defeated incumbent Wright. Young redeemed his campaign promises, pardoning the participants in the Steele murder and directing his attorney general to institute proceedings against defective titles. The great estates were being gradually divided, and the ballot box, not tar and feathers, led to the anti-rent victory.

James Fenimore Cooper described incidents in the anti-rent movement from a conservative position in "The Littlepage Manuscripts", a trilogy consisting of the novels "Satanstoe" (1845), "The Chainbearer" (1845), and "The Redskins" (1846).

OBITUARY: Walton Reporter, Dec 1908: Was in Anti-Rent War and Later Fought for the Union in Civil War--John Phoenix Dies at Ripe Age of 90 Years. John Phoenix died at his home at Cleaver Dec. 19th, in his 90th year. Deceased was born at Cabin Hill July 27, 1819, town of Andes, where his father, one of the early settlers of the county, had moved to as early as 1794 and settled on a farm. He grew up with the county and was a rugged, healthy man up to a few weeks before his death. He participated in the anti-rent riots during the early 40's and was one of the band who were brought to Delhi jail for the shooting of Deputy Sheriff Osmond Steel and with the rest of the party was confined for a time [in Dannemora State Prison] and afterwards pardoned by Gov. Young. Shortly after being pardoned he married Margaret Munson, who died 9 years ago. From that union he leaves behind him to mourn his loss 4 children, 28 grandchildren, 22 great-grandchildren; a record to be proud of as a sturdy pioneer of Delaware county. On September 2, 1864, he enlisted as a Union private in the Civil War, being a member of Co. G, 144th N.Y.V.I., and was discharged 9 months and 23 days later on June 25, 1865 with chronic diarrhea. Shortly after the war or in 1870, he moved to the farm at Cleaver, (P.O. address, Loomis) then known as Loomis brook where he died. He was a hard working, industrious man and with his noble wife soon cleared up the place and had it one of the best paying farms in the valley. Born at a time when schools were few and land must be cleared, he did not have the advantages of an education but made sure his children should. He could neither read or write.

Since the death of his wife his son Aaron and wife have tenderly cared for him. The funeral was held at his late residence Tuesday, the 22nd, at 11a.m., conducted by the Rev. Gritman of Cannonsville. Interment in the family plot at Trout Creek cemetery. The children are Aaron, at home; Hannah, wife of John Gilbert; Estelle, wife of Aaron Franks; Annie, wife of James Constable. Cause of death was old age and an attack of heart trouble.

MISC: According to Marianne (McCaffrey) Greenfield, John was a prisoner in Andersonville during the Civil War and returned home with his hair turned completely white. Lucille Dewey's records indicate that he entered the Civil War Sep 1864 for 1 year as PVT in the 144th NYV. His age was listed as 43 born in Delaware County and married.

In his house are two white males: 1 aged 10-16 and 1 aged over 45. No white male of Joseph's age (4) is listed. There are 2 free white females under age 10 and 1 aged 26-45.

1810 US Census: Again, Ralph is the only Potts listed. He is listed under free white males: 1 under 10, 1 between ages 26-45 and 1 45 & over. Joseph would have been 14 and is not listed. There were 2 white females; 1 under 10 and 1 aged 10-16. There was one slave listed.

1820 US Census: No Potts listed in Beaufort County.

1830 US Census: Joseph Potts and family listed for the first time in Beaufort County. At home were: Free White Males; 2 under 5,1 age 10-15, and 2 ages 30-40. There is one free white female age 20-30. There are 6 slaves.

1840 US Census: Washington Township, Beaufort County, NC, lists living in the home of Joseph Potts: Free White Males; 2 under age 5, 2 ages 5-10, 2 ages 10-15, and 1 age 40-50. Also listed are Free White Females; 1 age 5-10, 1 age 15-20, and 1 age 20-20. There are no slaves, free colored or foreigners not naturalized listed.

1850 US Census: lists Joseph Potts as a 55 year old merchant born in England with real estate worth \$11,500. He lived with wife, Elizabeth A., age 40 and children: William A., age 23; Elizabeth P., age 18; John R., age 12; and Mary P., age 3. Also living in the home was a male black painter, Carney Sparrow, age 50.

1860 US Census: Joseph was a 64 year old merchant whose real estate was valued at \$15,620 and personal property at \$40,325. Although not counted, some of this personal property could have been in slaves. He lived with wife, Elizabeth Ann, age 51, and children: John, a clerk, age 20; and Mary, age 12.

1870 US Census: lists Joseph as a merchant, age 74, born in England, whose real estate is valued at \$1,000 and personal property at \$385. He was living with wife Annie, age 62, born in Massachusetts and daughter, Mary P. Potts, age 21, born in NC.

1880 US Census: Joseph was living at the home of his son and daughter-in-law, William A. Potts and his wife, Josephine and their children: Ida, age 15; John, age 12; Zophar, age 9; Fred, age 7; and Nedia, age 6. Joseph died shortly thereafter. Also living in the house at that time was William Potts' nephew, Jesse Whitehosh, a store clerk, age 22.

Notes for Jacob (Bodyne) Bodine

The assumption is that the Jacob Bodine who married Elizabeth Delameter is the same as the Jacob and Elizabeth Bodine who appear in the 1850 Census of Middletown, Delaware County, New York. That connection is not certain, but it is quite possible.

It is highly likely that this Jacob's parents were Francis Bodine and Margaret Sluyter. They had children baptized at the Kingston DRC (Dutch Reformed Church) in Ulster County, New York between 1768 and 1792. One of those was a Jacob Bodine. He was baptized on January 31, 1774. That date would approximately match the birth dates that this Jacob might have had. This Jacob's birth years according to the censuses he was in, range from 1770 to 1775. Jacob and Elizabeth (Delameter) Bodine had a son, Francis, baptized at the Kingston DRC in 1800.

Although this family often went by the surname Budine, there is some good evidence that this family did sometimes go by the name Bodine. Jacob Budine's son, Moses, was listed as Moses Bodine in the 1880 Census of Hancock, New York. Moses' daughter, Jane, was listed as Jane Bodine in the May 28, 1864 edition of the Delphi Republican newspaper. And Moses' son, Marcus, was listed as Marcus Bodine in the 1880 Census of Walton, New York. Of course, the reporter or transcriber could have just incorrectly spelled their names, but maybe not.

All were shown as foreign born, not naturalized. If accurate, this would place their immigration to America between 1820 and 1825 (info from Terrence K. May's web site at WorldConnect).

LETTER FROM JEAN MCCADDIN TO CHRISTINA (?) (JULY 8, 1973):

Mother suspected that someone in the Beagle family might have served in the Revolution, and a friend of mine who belongs to the D.A.R. got me interested in looking into it. Years ago Mother copied some information from the family Bible, but we don't know who has the Bible now. My mother's father was Malvin Beagle, brother of your grandmother, Mary Jane Beagle. Their father was John Beagle, who married Margaret Rifenburg. According to the family Bible, John's father was Moses Beagle, who was born in 1788. I found that there was a John Beagle in the Revolution who had a son named Moses, who was born in 1788. He also had a daughter Mary. Mother's sister, Mary Beagle, was named for your grandmother, Mary Jane Beagle. I believe that the John Beagle who was in the Revolution was our ancestor, but I haven't been able to find proof. I need proof that our great-grandfather, John Beagle, was the son of Moses Beagle.

According to what I have learned, the first John Beagle was born in Holland in 1745. He fought in the Revolution for 7 years, was at the battle of Trenton and at Yorktown when Lord Cornwallis was captured. He then returned to Fishkill, N.Y., where he married Winchie Van Nosdall. They had 10 children, moved to Troy, then to Schoharie. If you have any information about the Beagles, I would be very much interested to learn it.

Moses Beagle married Sally Ann Bice, and they lived for many years in Davenport. If you would like, I'll write you more in another letter, about what I have learned about the first John Beagle. I was born in 1925 in N.Y.C., so we're about the same age

MARIANNE MCCAFFREY GREENFIELD: The birth records for Cornelius, Petrus and Benjamin are from the Old Dutch Church, Kingston, NY. There are no birth records there for Anthony or Abraham or any daughters. It is my belief that when the Revolutionary War had ended, William and Henrika, with infant Benjamin, moved from Hurley, Ulster County to Milford, Otsego County, New York, probably in 1791. Cornelius and Petrus (Peter) may have died in infancy as there is no further mention of them. There was no vital statistic record keeping mandated in the State of New York until 1883/4. There were no churches to record births, deaths and marriages in the wilderness to which they moved. Many Veterans received ¿bounty land¿ from the new American government, in lieu of wages they earned in the Patriot Army. William Constable was listed in the record of the Town of Milford, NY Town Meeting in 1798 as a Pathmaster, or road builder. William, Henrika, Benjamin, Anthony and Abraham moved from Milford to the South half of Lot # 96 of the Rapelje Patent, in what is now the Town of Tompkins, Delaware County, in 1814. Henrika Louw Constable applied for a pension after William died, which is on record at the National Archives, Washington, DC. William was Private in the NYS Troops and was injured in a skirmish between a group of Patriots and a band of Indians and Tories in the dense forest of the Shawngunk Mountains. William and Henrika lived adjacent to Benjamin, Anthony and Abraham in the Town of Tompkins, on the 1820 census.

LUCILLE DEWEY: "William Constable first came to Delaware Co. in the 1820's. He was a Revolutionary war veteran and was granted a pension while living in the Town of Tompkins in 1833. He lived to be very old and died between 90 and 100 years of age sometime after 1840. He moved to Delaware County with his wife, unknown, and his 3 sons, Benjamin, Anthony and Abram. All of the Constables from Delaware Co. are related to these 3 brothers. Unknown are the daughters - who changed their names when they were married."

Notes for Jean Bodin

FROM "DAVE'S BODINE GENEALOGY WEB SITE":

This Jean Bodin was born, it is said, in Medis, a village in the Canton of Saujon, District of Saintes, then located in the former French province of Saintonge, on May 9, 1645, based upon "a tradition universal in the family." This "traditional" statement is set forth by Mary Elisabeth Sinnott in her genealogical work, Annals of the Sinnott, Rogers, Coffin, Corlies, Reeves, Bodine and Allied Families (Philadelphia: J. B. Lippincott Co., 1905), p. 154. She does not state how this tradition came about. The year 1645 was noted earlier in E. P. Bodine's History of the Branch of the Bodine Family Founded by Cornelius Bodine, (Buffalo, 1897), p. 6 and in Biographical, Genealogical and descriptive History of the First Congressional District of New Jersey (New York: Lewis Publishing Company, 1900), ii, p. 283. The date May 9, 1645 was repeated, subsequent to Sinnott's publication, in Genealogical and Memorial History of the State of New Jersey (Lee, Francis Bazely, New York: Lewis Historical Publishing Company, 1910), iv, p. 1368, all of whom cited no references. No original source for this claim has yet been found. The location of his birth, Medis, appears to have some basis in fact. Upon having fled France, the French authorities noted his escape as "Boudin, fugitif de Medit, Election de Saintes" (Archives Nationales, Paris, TT No. 259).

Jean and Esther Bodin first removed to Soubize, a small village in the Canton of St. Agnant, District of Rochefort-sur-Mer. Accompanied by his wife, Esther, he fled his native country on Saturday, September 13, 1681, a date noted in the financial aid records of the Threadneedle Street Church in London. He arrived in Staten Island on 3 Nov 1677

The arrival in America of Jean Bodin can be ascertained only by June 19, 1701, when Jean Bodin, as a resident of Middlesex County, in the Province of East Jersey, purchased an 80 acre tract of land on Staten Island, New York from Johannes and Neeltje Messereau. Middlesex County was situated just across Hudson Bay from Staten Island.

It would appear from probate records that Jean Bodin, now better known as John Bodine, died shortly before March 24, 1708. His death likely occured shortly before January 3, 1708 when his will was noted in New York Calendar of Land Papers, iv (1704-1709), p. 81.

JEAN BOOTH: From data researched and compiled by Jean Booth, Jacksonville, FL (Jan 1984), from Gen & Mem History of NJ, Vol 4, P 1368; and Bodine Family History, p 260-9; and Bodine Family History by Stinnet, p 156:

BOWDOIN COLLEGE: The following information is from a "Historical and Biographical Sketch of the Bowden, Bodine, Beaudoin, (Boden, Bodin, Bowdoin) Family, available at Bowdoin College, Brunswick, Maine. (George J. Mitchell Department of Special Collections & Archives).

The surnames Bowden, Bodine, Beaudoin including their many variations in spelling (Boden, Bodin, Bowdoin, etc.) are derived from the Baptismal Form meaning, "The Son of Baldwin". Another source states that the derivation is from a local name meaning "of Bowden", a parish in East Cheshire, England. Popularly and under French influence, the above surnames have been passed down to the present day. Changes of spelling of the surname even by members of the same family have been common. Consequently, the ancestor of a present day Boden might have spelled his name Bodine or Beaudoin. The Bodines (Bowdens) of New York, New Jersey, and of America have their origin in the Family of Le Boudin or De Boudain and the antiquity of the surname is attested by the French Charters of the twelfth Century. The family, Le Boudin was settled in Cambray, France, originally a district in the Low Countries as early as 1126.

Jean Bodine of the Cambray Family removed from Medis, in the Province of Saintonge, France to Holland and England, prior to emigrating to New York. He was a French Huguenot and was forced to flee France at this period of religious persecutions. He settled at Staten Island, at which place he had a survey of land April 1, 1686. Nothing is known of his wife or other children. Issue: Jean
