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

OBITUARY: From the Sidney Tri-Town News, Aug 11, 1971: Endwell, NY-Raymond T. Simpson, 69, of Endwell, died on Wednesday, August 4, 1971, at his home, 108 Hooper Road, after a long illness. Notes for Alma Henderson Duffield

OBITUARY: Alma Duffield Ready, 95, died after a short illness on Thursday, May 29, 2003 at Holy Cross Hospital in Nogales, Arizona, where she has been a patient for the last few years.

Alma, an only child, was born in Cedarville, New Jersey on December 17, 1907 to Philip and Ada (Henderson) Duffield. At the age of 14 she was already an accomplished organist and once played for the church choir when it was invited to sing on the air 120 miles away at a Philadelphia radio station. Later, she graduated from New Jersey State College at Glassboro, where she studied to be a teacher and played the beautiful big concert piano at morning assemblies and for the Glee Club.

Years later, After the breakup of her first three marriages, Alma and her fourth (and last) husband Teddy moved to Arizona. She immediately fell in love with the state. She said, "To me the desert was a dream come true." After moving from Willcox to Oracle to Continental, they wound up in Tucson where both got jobs at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base. By now they were three'son Johnny had been born in 1946. Totally fascinated with the west, the family began exploring its beauty, venturing farther and farther on weekends and holidays. Johnny grew up as a prop in front of hundreds of photos. Eventually their long summer excursions became the pivot around which their lives revolved. Alma began

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carrying a camera and taking notes. She joined the Tucson Camera Club and began winning local photo contests.

Her first sale was to Arizona Highways Magazine. That article was followed by another and another and then she was commissioned to do several pieces for a forthcoming issue featuring Santa Cruz County. She also began a series of picture pages for the Arizona Republic's Sunday Magazine, "Days and Ways."

While trying to put together a portfolio of pictures of Santa Cruz County, which the family had explored so thoroughly, she learned from a Nogales librarian that, much to her surprise, the county's history had never been written. So, "to do the job right," she wrote, "I needed to live in Santa Cruz County!" By now, she had discovered that she liked to write

In 1967 she leased an apartment in Nogales for a year and joined the local historical society. By now, son Johnny had graduated from high school in Tucson and Ted had no objections to her move. She also began a new job as Southern Arizona correspondent for the Arizona Republic, the state's largest newspaper. At the age of sixty she had started a new career, and continued writing for the paper for 14 years, approximately from 1967-1981.

It took her six years to finish the Santa Cruz County history, "Open Range and Hidden Silver." She also wrote "Calabasas: A True Story," "A Very Small Place: Arizona's Santa Cruz County Book List," and wrote and edited the "Nogales Arizona 1880-1980 Centennial Anniversary" book. All of them are available at the Pimeria Alta Historical Society, located in their museum on 136 North Grand Avenue in Nogales.

She attended classes in photography and conversational Spanish and became very active in the Pimeria Alta Historical Society. As Society president, she soon realized it needed a great deal of space for a museum. After learning that the old Nogales Town Hall was available, she ramrodded a successful effort to move in. Today it occupies the entire bottom floor. For two years she did a full-page photo feature each month for the local "Nogales International" newspaper.

Alma had many friends, and was a lover of art, music, poetry, and everything Arizona. She will be deeply missed by her family and the many people whose lives she has touched over the years. About Nogales she wrote: "I have been very happy here. The country is beautiful, the 'Border Culture' fascinating, the people friendly and the climate near-perfect. This is where I feel at home."

They say that home is where the heart is and Alma's heart indeed found a home in Nogales.

A memorial service will be held at 4:00 pm Saturday, June 21 at the Pimeria Alta Historical Society, located in their museum on 136 North Grand Avenue in Nogales.

Alma was preceded in death by her husband Ted, who passed away in 1986, and her son, James E. Simpson, who died in 1968. She is survived by three sons: Donald C. Flowers, of Novi, Michigan; Patrick D. Simpson, of Raleigh, North Carolina; and Johnny Ready, of Snellville, Georgia. She also leaves behind several grandchildren and great-grandchildren as well as a host of friends all over Arizona.

They separated in 1937 at age 29. She married Raymond Simpson in 1937 and had 2 sons, Patrick and James, before her divorce in 1945. PHILIP S. DUFFIELD - BIOGRAPHY: From MOBILIFE December, 1954, a publication of Socony-Vacuum Oil Company, Paulsboro, NJ.

Another well known citizen of Cedarville, New Jersey is one of Paulsboro Refinery's oldest annuitants - Phillip S. Duffield, who is 84 [Social Security #066-07-7255]. Phil retired in 1941 after seventeen years service. He was first a checker in the Package Division. Because of his experience as a telegraph operator Phil was later made switch-board operator in the Main Office. He liked the 6 P.M. to 7 A.M. Shift. That was when Carl Hamm was Superintendent. In those days, Mr. Hamm made a weekly trip to New York. In order to make sure he got up on time, he always had Phil call desire to see a grand turnout him at 4 A. M. Phil says he worried about staying awake to get Mr. Hamm up on time. He is proud to think he never missed.

Philip Duffield, or "Duffle" as the townsfolk call him, is a straight-backed man with exceptionally clear eyes. He says, "There is nothing the matter with me." The truth of that statement is revealed by his hobby of bicycling. He pedals to Fortescue, Port Norris, Bivalve, Bridgeton or Millville, towns within a radius of 8-12 miles. He says it's good for him.

Before Phil worked at Paulsboro Refinery he was supervisor of the gun cotton line in Du Pont's Hopewell, Virginia plant. Previous to that he was ticket agent at the East Bridgeton office of the Jersey Central Railroad, on the Cumberland-Maurice River Branch.

Ticket agents were also telegraph operators. Phil learned his "dot-dash" at the Valentine Telegraph School in Janesville, Wisconsin. His instructor was George S. Parker, who had already invented the famous Parker Pen. He sold pens to his pupils at cost so they would be tested under actual working conditions. Today Parker Pens are known throughout the world. p36 written by James Bartz in 1937 at age 13: "The first school in the Sidney Center District was located on the Simpson Farm (Floyd Roof's). A little while later it was moved to about where Mr. Sagendorf's farm is now."

Simpson was carried downstream, another was taken off its foundation but lodged against the barn."

p52: "June 5, 1923--A meeting of the Cemetery Association was held at the home of Albert Youngs last Saturday evening. A committee of 5was appointed to solicit funds and take charge of the work of laying a concrete walk to Highland Cemetery. The committee is composed of A.H. Simpson, Secretary; James Hodges, Treasurer; Albert Youngs, Joseph Mudford and G.E. Holley."

WEDDING: From local newspaper, 1900 or 1906: "Hymneal - Simpson-Youngs. About forty relatives and friends assembled at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Youngs in Sidney Centre Thursday, March 29, to witness the marriage of their daughter, Mary A., to Albert H. Simpson. The ceremonies of the occasion were entirely free from formality the couple mingling with the company and visiting until the time for the ceremony, when they took their places under the festoons of evergreens, arranged for the occasion, and were married. The Rev. L.H. Long, of Calicoon Depot,

brother-in-law of the bride, was the officiating minister. After the ceremony a beautiful dinner was served and then the happy couple left on train 1 for a short wedding trip. In a few days Mr. and Mrs. Simpson will commence housekeeping in the house of D.R. Southard near the ME Church. Many presents were given the bride and groom and had among their money gifts amounts to quite a sum. Mr, Simpson is Sidney Centre's postmaster and is well known to Delaware County. Miss Youngs was one of Sidney Centre's most highly esteemed young ladies."

BERT'S LETTER: Letter from A.H. Simpson to his aunt Mary Jane (Simpson Beardsley) Moss in Oregon, undated: "I am still the Postmaster here which takes up part of my time. Mary helps me in the office and we have a boy that helps nights and mornings and goes to school. I can just remember you as you looked the night you started west a good many years ago - Frankie and I were small then - Now we will soon be old folks if we live. I wish we could see you all and some time I intend to come to the Coast - but we can't go anywhere now on account of the Post Office. How are all my cousins getting along? Write me all about them what their business is and how many children they have and everything. I remember soon after Frankie was married we heard her husband had very poor health - Has he gotten all strong? Did any of you get a chance to see the President in his recent trip to the West? I have seen him once. We had strawberry shortcake for dinner today and will have one for tomorrow - but the berries were not grown here - they came from the south. Ours will be ripe in about 10 days. Write soon. Your nephew, A.H. Simpson"

Bert was active in the Methodist Church and was a loyal Republican. He died in 1915...cause of death - cancer.

OBITUARY: Tri-Town News, March 29, 1924: DEATH OF BELOVED RESIDENT. Edward S. Shaw, Long an Invalid, Enters Eternal Rest At His Home In Sidney. Ill health, dating well nigh 40 years is merciless from the fact that it spares neither the just nor the unjust. All are liable to suffer, the good, the bad and the indifferent.

We are reminded of that fact by the death at his home in this village, Friday afternoon, 21st inst of the late Edward Smith Shaw, who during his whole life time of 79 years had resided in the Township of Sidney, principally at Sidney Center, always esteemed and held in high respect by all who were acquainted with him and his family.

It can be truly said that Mr. Shaw entered into rest from a life that had denied him its most valuable possession, which is good health. For forty years on account of stomach trouble he could eat no solid food of any kind, subsisting only on the very lightest nourishment. Yet, in spite of this Mr. Shaw was always cheerful in the society of family and friends, never complained, bearing his long suffering with courage and fortitude. His last illness was of only a few days duration and at the end he peacefully passed away to the deep regret of a large circle of devoted relatives and sincere friends.

His whole life was one of true devotion to his family. Mr. and Mrs. Shaw enjoyed the peace and contentment of 57 years of married life, Mrs. Shaw at the time of her marriage was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Patrick of Sidney Center, where the joyous celebration or their golden wedding anniversary gave expression to the widespread esteem and love of all. Mr. and Mrs. Edward Shaw were a most devoted couple, both tenderly devoted to each other, living most happy, contented lives, helping and cheering one another. The presents for the occasion were numerous and beautiful.

The funeral services on Monday afternoon, 24th, by the large attendance gave ample evidence of the esteem in which Mr. Shaw and family is everywhere held. The services were conducted by the Rev. A. D. Finch, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church, who tenderly spoke of the useful, kindly life just closed. The flowers were especially beautiful as well as numerous tributes of loving affection. The bearers were all his grandsons and the remains were conveyed to Sidney Center, N.Y.

Surviving In the immediate family besides the widow, are two daughters, Mrs. J. C. Simpson, of Sidney and Mrs. O. L. Benedict, of Sidney Center, N. Y. Also one brother, former Supervisor Shaw, of Binghamton and one sister, Mrs. Comstalk, of Sidney Center, and numerous grandchildren. The deepest sympathy of all goes forth to them in their bereavement.

Tri-Town News, 1934: Mrs. Sarah J. Shaw, widow of the late Edward S. Shaw, passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. J.C. Simpson in this village, Saturday night after an illness of about nine weeks, at the age of 85 years, she having been born September 13, 1849.

Mrs. Shaw was born at Sidney Center, the daughter of James and Mary Patrick. She was married to Edward Shaw, September 5, 1867 and to them were born three daughters, Ida B. Benedict of Sidney Center, Rosamond Hoyt, deceased, and Mary A. Simpson of this village. Mr. Shaw died at their home in this village March 21, 1924. Besides the two daughters, she is survived by eight grandchildren, 15 great grandchildren and two great-great grandchildren.

Nearly all of Mrs. Shaw's life was spent in Sidney Center, she and her husband coming to Sidney to make their home about 15 years ago. In her girlhood she united with the Sidney Center Methodist church, in which she retained her membership until the end of her life. In the village where most of her life was spent she was highly regarded not only for her Christian virtues but for her kindness and sincere regard for the happiness of her neighbors. During the years in Sidney she made many friends, although advancing age compelled her closer confinement to the home. Notes for William Simpson

BIO AND CENSUS: Just to the north of Sand Hill lay the town of Butternuts. Its name was derived from three butternut trees growing from one stump, which marked the corner of the three towns of Pittsfield, New Lisbon and Butternuts. On the "first Sabbath" of January, 1839, according to records of the Presbyterian Church (formerly First Congregational) in the village of Butternuts (now Gilbertsville), Mary Jane's parents, former Methodists William Simpson and his wife (Lavinia) were received "by examination" into the church. William was baptized that day and four months later, on May 5, 1839, William's two-month-old daughter, Mary Jane Simpson, was also baptized.

1840 US census: lists William Simpson living in Butternut, Delaware County, NY State. With him were two sons and one daughter under 5, and 1 daughter age 5-10. William and his wife were between ages 20-30.

By 1850 they had moved a few miles southeast down Otsdawa Creek's west branch in the town of Otego. In 1850, Living together were: William Simpson (38), Lovinia (39), Jane (11), Harriet (9). Lewis (8) and Helen (6).

By 1855 they had moved again, this time southwest to a 132-acre farm across the Susquehanna River into Delaware County. Sixteen-year-old Mary Jane and her family now lived in Maplefront (now Youngs Station), an area halfway between the villages of Sidney Plains (now Sidney) and Sidney Center. They owned a 132-acre farm near Carrs Creek.

1860 US census: records for 1860 indicate William was a 47 year old farmer with real estate valued at \$1500 and personal assets of \$176. His tombstone says he was age 81. Still at home on August 10, 1860 were wife Lavinia, age 48; Lewis, age 18; Helen, age 16; and Alvina, age 3.

William's son, Lewis Simpson, died 1 May 1863 from injuries in the Civil War.

Another son, Justus, left home 14 April 1865 [the day Lincoln was shot], for Kankakee, Illinois.

Around 1867, William deserted his wife and moved to Western New York State.

In the 1880 US Census, William Simpson is listed on page 29, Supervisor's Dist. No. 9, Enumeration Dist. No. 162 as living in Campbell, Steuben County, N.Y. He is a W M age 68, living with wife Sarah W F 60, and 2 stepsons: George Grimes (22) and Charles Grimes (17). George "works on farm" and Charles was "at school."

After the death of Lewis's mother Lovinia (nee Youngs, William's first wife) in 1890, William tried to claim his son's military pension. The affidavits describe him as having deserted his Sidney Center, NY family in 1867 and later turning up in Campbell, NY. He was also described as very poor.

The 1860 US census lists Sarah Grimes, age 44 as being born about 1816 in New York State. In 1860 she was living in Bradford, Steuben, New York. Her husband was Norman Grimes, 44, and she had a son George, age 2. At the time she had 7 other children: Philander, Mary Jane, Julia, Daniel, Morran, Orrin, & Lucy. Son Charles would not have been born vet.

From a letter dated 19 Feb 1890, Sidney Center, NY, written by daughter Allie: "Mother died Saturday evening at half past 7 o'clock and was buried here to the Center yesterday the 18 of Feb." Her tombstone says she died 15 Feb 1890 age 77 years 8 months 1 day. It also says, "Heaven is my home at last."

Notes: BIOGRAPHY: All the honor that belongs to the high-minded, public-spirited citizen belongs of right to Justus L. Simpson, of Francesville, Indiana, but it is as a soldier that Mr. Simpson has the strongest claim on the admiration of his fellow citizens. He is not only a soldier, but the grandson of a soldier, and his service in the war of the states in behalf of the Union was so heroic and his sufferings were so great that his military experience was exceptional in many ways.

Mr. Simpson was born on a farm near Gilbertsville, Otsego County, New York, May 16, 1837, a son of William and Lovina (Young) Simpson. His father's father did gallant service in the war of 1813-14. Records of other wars in America and in England bear the name of Simpson so prominently that there can be no question that Justus L. Simpson inherited the military instinct and predilection in an unusual degree.

August 30, 1862, when he was a little past twenty-five years old, he enlisted at Gilbertsville, New York, as a private in Company G, One Hundred and Fifty-second Regiment, New York Volunteer Infantry, to serve three years or during the war. He served until honorably discharged, February 4, 1865, on account of wounds received in a charge in the battle of Hanover Court House, Virginia. He participated in a charge on the rebel works at the battle of Suffolk, Virginia, and in the Wilderness campaign he was under constant fire for twenty-two days, from May 2 to May 24, 1864.

The principal battles of this series were those of the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, North Anna Court House and Hanover Court House. In the last named engagement he was shot, May 24, 1864, under the following interesting circumstances: His regiment was deployed for service on the skirmish line. After twenty-four hours' arduous service it was relieved and sent to the rear among the reserves, but was almost at once called upon to relieve a regiment which had exhausted its ammunition, and took its place on the firing line in the woods, where it was under direct and galling fire in front of the enemy. The soldiers availed themselves of such shelter as trees offered, and Comrade Simpson gained the slight protection of the tree, whose trunk was about six inches in diameter. He was on his knees, loading his musket, when he found that a rebel sharpshooter had him in range. One shot struck the tree directly in front and in range of his forehead, and a second and a third shot narrowly missed him. A lieutenant standing about a rod in his rear cautioned him to look out as a sharpshooter had located him. As many as nine or ten shots came close to him, and soon he was struck, the ball passing through the flesh of the upper part of the left leg, and through the right leg, cutting off the leaders and making a fearful wound. Comrade Simpson attempted to gain the shelter of a large tree a little distance in the rear, but found he could not walk. The lieutenant ordered two men to take him to the shelter of the tree. There he fainted, and, according to his vivid imagination, beautiful flowers, trees and fine white houses appeared to him with remarkable distinctness and minuteness. This pleasing illusion was followed by loud noises and great distress. Still unconscious, he was carried to the rear in a rubber blanket by four comrades, who finally procured a stretcher, and he was taken to the field hospital, about two and a half miles from the place where he was shot. His wound was dressed, and he lay in the hospital until next day, when he was taken to the Potomac River and by steamboat to Washington, where he was placed in the Columbia College Hospital, and remained until about August 20, when he was transferred to Philadelphia and placed in Judicial Square Hospital. Gangrene in his wounds set in soon after, and then he fully expected death from day to day. The physician at Judicial Square Hospital told him he had but one

chance for his life, and that was at Turner Lane Hospital. He was so weak that he was removed only with great difficulty, stimulated by four ounces of brandy. Here Dr. King, of Pottsville, Pennsylvania, was his physician. This very skillful surgeon removed the mortified flesh with much difficulty by repeated burnings. The operation was a terrible one, and it is impossible to realize Mr. Simpson's sufferings. The flesh was eaten away until he could have put his hand into the wound. His brother George visited him in September, 1864, and when he first saw him thought he was dead, so deathly was his appearance and so awful his condition of emaciation and weakness as he lay for fresh air under a tent. The patient did not know his brother. Mr. Simpson feels that he owes his life to Dr. King, to the Sanitary Commission, and to benevolent ladies who came every day to visit the sick and bring them flowers and delicacies.

Until wounded Comrade Simpson was always an active soldier, and was in all the campaigns, marches, battles and skirmishes in which his regiment took part, and was prompt and cheerful in the discharge of all his duties. He received a severe sunstroke in 1863, and still feels the effects of it. He was then on a forced march, but did not leave his regiment. He left his home in New York State, April 14, 1865 [the day Lincoln was shot], for Illinois, and went directly to Kankakee. After a short visit he went to Iroquois county, Illinois, as a cattle-herder, and remained there one year. As he rode a horse he could do this kind of work, but was very lame, and could not get his heel to the ground for two years after he left the service. For two years afterward he was overseer for the firm of Milk, Bancroft & Serring on a farm of six hundred and fifty acres, all planted in corn. Later, and until 1871, he managed another large farm. Meantime, December 22, 1868, he had married, at Kankakee, Illinois, Susan E. Clemans, a native of Wayne County, New York, and a daughter of Lorenzo and Sarah (Kelly) Clemans.

Lorenzo Clemans was born in Wayne County, New York, in a house which had been built in the pioneer days by his father, Dr. Asaph Clemans. Dr. Clemans, whose mother was a sister of General Israel Putnam, of Revolutionary fame, was of Puritan stock and married Orpha Ives, a daughter of Moses Ives, who was a Revolutionary soldier from Connecticut. They had children named Moses, Asaph, Rensselaer, Putney, Nancy, Clarissa, Polly and Susannah. The Doctor, who took his medical degree in Rochester, New York, was in his day a distinguished physician and a man of much property, who acquired a considerable landed estate, most of which is now owned by his descendants. In political faith he was for many years an old-line Whig. He was one of the organizers of the Republican Party and voted for Fremont and for Lincoln. He was an active member of the Methodist church and a class-leader in his organization, and died aged seventy-two, after a busy and useful life. Lorenzo Clemans, son of Asaph Clemans and father of Mrs. Simpson, was born about 1818, and died aged seventy-eight. He was a successful farmer and married Sarah Kelly, a native of Oneida County, New York. The family of Kelly is prominent in New York, especially in Buffalo, and Mrs. Lorenzo Clemans' sister, Mary, married a general of the Confederate army.

Mrs. Clemans had two brothers, named Joseph and Ezekiel. The children of Mr. and Mrs. Clemans were named Oscar, Lydia, Orson, Susan E., Ann, Colista, Rensselaer and George. Oscar, who was a member of a New York infantry regiment, died the death of a soldier during the civil war.

In 1875 Justus L. Simpson removed, with his wife, to Newton County, Indiana, and managed a cattle ranch for Lemuel Milk, of Kankakee, Illinois, until 1876, when he bought his present farm in Salem Township, which was known as the old Nathaniel Waple farm. He has lived on this place since 1876, and has improved it by drainage and by the erection of new buildings. His residence, in the midst of a beautiful grove, is one of the most tasteful and attractive in this part of the county, and the hospitality dispensed under its roof is as generous as it is spontaneous. To Mr. and Mrs. Simpson have been born five children: Jennie A., Cora M., Romeo, Jessie Ray and Sherrie. Romeo died in infancy; the others survive. Jennie A. and Cora M. became well known school-teachers. The former taught at Francesville and at other points in Pulaski county for nine years and is now the wife of William Bechdolt, of Oregon. Cora M. has had an experience of ten years in the public schools and is now teaching in the high school in Salem Township. She attended the normal school at Valparaiso, Indiana, and Terre Haute state normal. Jessie Ray lives in Oregon, and Sherrie on the home farm. Mrs. Simpson and her daughters are members of the Christian church. Comrade Simpson is a Grand Army man and a good Republican. While a resident of Newton County he served the people of McClellan Township as assessor and as trustee. He is influential in his part of the county, because those who know him have confidence in his integrity and good judgment.

HISTORY: (Newton Co., IN Biography: Newton County, McClellan Township. From A History

of Warren, Benton, Jasper & Newton Counties, 1883): Justus L. Simpson was born in Otsego County, New York, May 16, 1837. He is one of seven children of William and Lovina A. (Young) Simpson, natives of New York. He received his education in the common schools of his native state. At the age of ten, he was adopted by S. Platt, with whom he lived until twenty-one.

He then worked by the month until 1862, when he enlisted in Company G, One Hundred and Fifty-second New York Volunteer Infantry, and served with the regiment until discharged February 24, 1865. He participated in all marches of his regiment, being under Gen. Dix at the siege of Suffolk in the Peninsular campaign. During the New York riots, his regiment was ordered out, after which they were transferred to the Army of the Potomac, under Gen. Grant. He was at the battles of the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, and, while charging the enemy's works at Hanover Court House, received a gunshot wound in the leg, which laid him up eighteen months, and from the effects of which he has never entirely recovered.

On December 22, 1868, Justus married, at Kankakee, Illinois, Susan E. Clemans, of Wayne County, New York, the daughter of Lorenzo D. and Sarah (Kelly) Clemens. Four children were been born to them, three of whom, Jennie A., Cora M. and Jesse R., survived. Romeo died in infancy. In 1875, Mr. Simpson came to McClellan Township, Newton County, Indiana, where he has since managed a cattle ranch for Lemuel Milk. It consists of 3,000 acres, upon which are several hundred cattle. In politics, Mr. Simpson is Republican, and one of the foremost men of the township.

HEPPNER: (Heppner Herald, May 21, 1915) J.L. Simpson honored on his 78th Birthday. Last Sunday was a happy day for Mr. J.L. Simpson and one which he will remember the rest of his life. On that day was celebrated his 78th birthday and a number of his relatives gathered at the beautiful Simpson home in west Heppner and observed this event in a fitting manner. One of the treats of the day was the three-course dinner which was prepared by his able and loving wife. During the day Mr. and Mrs. Simpson were often called upon to relate stories of their early life and struggles back in their old home in New York and Indiana and it is not amiss here to give a brief account of the lives of these two well known people who have lived in Heppner for the past eight years and who have made a wide circle of friends and have been agents for good in the community.

"Mr. Simpson was born in Otsego County, New York, in the year 1837. His father was a soldier in the War of 1812 and the son also served his country during the terrible Civil War and was mustered out in 1865 on account of wounds received in the battle of Hanover Court House, Virginia. After the war he went to Illinois and there met Miss Susan E. Clemans and the two young people were married in the year 1868. Mrs. Simpson's parents were likewise descendants of men and women who had been prominently identified with the early history of this country.

In 1875 they moved to Indiana where they lived until they came to Oregon several years ago. For some time they lived at Milton and then came to Heppner. They enjoy excellent health here and have one of the most attractive homes in our city.

Among those present at Mr. Simpson's birthday celebration were Mrs. J.M. Moss of Milton, a sister; Mr. and Mrs. William Frazier of Milton, the latter being a niece of Mr. Simpson; Mr. and Mrs. W.W. Bechdolt and two children of Hardman, Mrs. Bechdolt being a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Simpson. The Herald joins with their friends in hoping that they will live to enjoy many such events as the one just mentioned."

Justus was a member of the N.Y. Volunteer Infantry in the Civil War and was wounded in the battle of Hanover Court House, Virginia. He was mustered out because of his wounds in 1865. He married Susan E. Clemans of the Clemans family of Illinois, Heppner Pioneers in 1868 and moved to Indiana in 1875. He moved to Milton, Oregon in 1905 and to Heppner, Oregon in 1907 where he died July 2, 1917. He was buried in the Heppner cemetery on the 4th of July, 1917 at the age of 80.

According to material from the Frazier Farmstead Museum in Milton-Freewater, Oregon, he had 2 daughters and 2 sons. One (unnamed) daughter married W. W. (J.) Bechdolt in Hardman, Oregon (now a ghost town). Daughter Cora May married E.J. Merrill, also from Hardman. Son J.R. (Jessie Ray?) Simpson lived in Monon, Indiana. Son S.A. Simpson (Sherry) lived in Medaryville, Indiana. Justus died a member of the GAR and the Christian Church in Heppner, Oregon.

(Heppner Herald, Friday, July 6, 1917) J.L. Simpson, an aged and highly respected resident of Heppner passed away at his home here Monday, July 2, aged 80 years. Deceased was a native of New York state and lived for a time in Indiana before coming to Oregon 12 yearsago. The family first settled at Milton, remaining there two years, removing to Heppner ten years ago.

He was a veteran of the civil war being a member of the New York Volunteer Infantry. He was an

honored member of the G.A.R. and of the Christian church. He is survived by a widow and four children. The children are: Mrs. J. Bechdolt and Mrs. E.J. Merrill, of Hardman, J.R. Simpson, of Monon, Ind., and S.A. Simpson, of Medaryville, Ind. A brother and sister in New York state and a sister at Milton, Oregon, also survive him. Funeral services were held in the Christian church Wednesday July 4, at 9:30 a.m., internment being in Heppner cemetery.

CENSUSES: Justus lived in Kankakee County, Illinois 1865 to 1875; Pulaski & Newton Counties, Indiana 1875 to 1904; Milton, Oregon 1904 to 1906; Heppner, Oregon 1906 to 1917.

In 1850, Justus Simpson (14) was living in Butternuts, Otsego, New York with Slawson Platt (56), Minerva Platt (54) and Jane A. Platt (19).

1880 US Census for McClelland Township, Newton County, Indiana lists Justice L. Simpson (44), Susan E. Simpson (32), Jennie A. (11 b. Illinois), Cora Ann (10 b. Illinois), Jessie R. (3 b. Indiana). In 1900 Justus (63) lived in Salem, Pulaski, Indiana with wife Susan E, (50), Cora M. (28), Jessie R. (23) and Sherrie A. (17).

By 1910, Justus (72) lived in MT Vernon Precinct, Heppner City, Morrow County, Oregon with Susan (60).

BUTTERNUTS: The town of Morris was originated from Butternuts April 6, 1849. The town of Butternuts, with which Morris was connected, derives its name from three butternut trees growing from one stump, which marked the corner of the three towns of Pittsfield, New Lisbon and Butternuts. This village was first called Louisville, in honor of Louis, brother of Paschal Franchot; but trouble having been produced by Louisville wishing to be separated from Butternuts, the dispute was finally settled by giving it the name of Morris, in honor of Gen. Jacob Morris. During the decade 1830-1840, Morris passed through its "stone age," according to an article in the Morris Chronicle in 1917. Five large stone buildings were built, including the Gardner hotel (later Morris Inn).

v **Harriet E. (Hatty)**⁶ **Simpson**, born 16 Sep 1841; died in Sidney Center, Delaware, NY. She married **Edward Barton**. Notes: Separated in 1864? Harriet's first marriage produced one son (Gains?).

She had two daughters from her second marriage, Rose Barton and Harriet Barton. Harriet Barton never married.

vi **Lewis L.** Simpson, born 11 Aug 1842 in Unadilla, Otsego, NY; died 1 May 1863 in Unadilla, Otsego, NY. Notes: MILITARY: Lewis L. Simpson joined the Union Army as a Private in Company K, 89th Regiment of New York Volunteers on September 17, 1861 at the Village of Unadilla, in Otsego County, N.Y. Co. K was commanded by Frank Burt.

On September 14, 1862 Lewis received a wound in the left knee by a mini ball at the battle of South Mountain in Maryland (Fox's Gap). Because of this wound, Lewis's left leg was amputated just above the knee at the United States Hospital in Maryland, on or about September 17, 1862. On February 5, 1863, Lewis L. Simpson received a Certificate of Disability for Discharge. Five days later, in Washington, D.C., he applied for a Pension.

Lewis returned home and died in May 1, 1863. There may have been contributory negligence on his part causing the necessity for a second amputation, and consequently the fatal result. There may have been surgical malpractice in the case. Lewis had never married nor were there any children. He was buried in the Methodist church cemetery in Sand Hill, New York, a tiny settlement near Wells Bridge, New York. Both military and pension records exist for Lewis as his mother later applied for his pension. When she died her estranged husband (William Simpson) also applied.

1857 POORHOUSE INVESTIGATION: This is a two-story house of wood, very old and dilapidated, thirty by forty feet. Beside this is an asylum twenty-five by thirty feet. Attached is a farm of one hundred and seventy-five acres yielding a revenue of \$250.00. The basements are used only for the storage of produce. In the house are twelve rooms heated by stoves and furnaces, destitute of ventilation and with extremely low ceilings. The number of inmates was fifty-eight; twenty-five males and thirty-three females; of these two-thirds are native and one-third foreign born; eleven are under sixteen years of age. The sexes are kept separate. They are under one keeper assisted by his wife. From two to twelve paupers are placed in a single room. The average number of inmates is sixty-five; supported at an average weekly cost of one dollar. The able males are employed on the farm and the women about the house. Once during the year past the supervisors have visited the house. It is supplied with Bibles, and there are occasional religious services; the children are sent to the district school. The superintendent procures supplies for the house, and prescribes rules and regulations concerning government and system of diet. He also binds out the children and exercises the power of discharging lunatics. A physician is employed by the year, who visits the house when called. There are no arrangements for bathing and no water for the house except what is drawn from the river. They have a well, which is now (August 16,) dry. During the year have occurred seven

Of the inmates, thirteen are lunatics; three males, ten females, all except one are paupers. For the reception of lunatics is erected another and separate building, in size twenty-five by thirty feet. In this are fourteen cells, close and without means of light or ventilation, except by a small diamond hole in the door. The inmates sleep on straw changed once a week. Two are confined in these cells the whole time and all at night. They have no special medical or other attendance. Sometimes they are restrained by handcuffs. The keeper reports two as improved and three cured during the year; but the committee fails to discover how improvement or cures can be effected with the facilities here offered. Eight of the paupers are idiots; five males, three females. There is one deaf and dumb.

He had \$1,200 in real estate and \$689 in personal property. Living with them were four children: Edward, 16; Frederick, 14; Susan, 8; and Emory, 2.

1880 Federal census lists farmer William on page 5 dwelling 41 family 47. Son Fred A. Shaw, age 29, now lives nearby (page 6 dwelling 45 family 51) with his wife Sarah, 34 and infant son, Frank.

CENSUS: Federal census for 1860 indicates James was a 43-year-old Town of Sidney, Delaware Co., NY farmer with assets of \$5000 in real estate and \$110 0 in personal assets. The 1870 census lists him as age 53, with assets of \$7000 real estate and \$1700 personal. (page 64, dwelling 466, family 492). His parents were born in Connecticut.
