Notes for Isaac Gomez

BY ISAAC GOMEZ - born in New York on the 28th July 1768:

"My Great, Great Grandfather, Isaac Gomez, was a Spanish nobleman a favorite at the Court and particularly noticed by the King. The Inquisition formed a plan to take him and his family and confiscate his estate on account of his being of the Jewish persuasion. The King having found it out let him know of it by a letter in terms not to be understood by any person but himself on which information he sent his wife and infant son, Moses, with some of his jewels to France, but before he could get ready with his other property to make his escape the Inquisition laid hold of him and made him a prisoner for fourteen years and confiscated all his property. Whether they let him out or he made his escape, I am not informed, but at the end of fourteen years he got over to France where his son got to be a fine boy. He after that had two daughters, one married a Leghorn, his name I know not. The name of the other daughter, Leonora. He died in France."

Notes for Luis Moses Gomez

Luis lived in France and England. Settled in New York 1696-1702.

In 1714 Luis Moses Gomez, who had fled from the Spanish inquisition, purchased 6,000 acres of land along the Hudson Highlands where several Indian trails converged. Here he built a fieldstone block house into the side of a hill and by a stream that became known as "Jews Creek."

The great walls of the house - which are about three feet thick - still stand today. Native Americans came to hold ceremonial rites at their campground at the Duyfil's Danskammer (Devil's Dance Chamber) on the shores of the Hudson on Gomez's property. For some thirty years Luis Gomez and his sons conducted a thriving fur trade from the fortress like house. Luis Moses Gomez became the first parnas (president) when the synagogue of New York's Spanish and Portuguese congregation was built. Among the family connections were poetess Emma Lazarus and Supreme Court Justice Benjamin Cardozo.

BY ISAAC GOMEZ - born in New York on the 28th July 1768:

"My Great Grandfather Luis Moses Gomez (his only son who got the name of Luis I suppose in respect to the King of France) (his country being the asylum of the family) married Miss Esther Markaze by whom he had six sons, namely, Jacob, Mordicia, Daniel, David, Isaac and Benjamin, with whom and his sister Leonora went over to Great Britain, I believe at the time of the religious distress of the Huguenots in France. How long he remained in England, I know not but he obtained a letter of denization which I now have in my possession from the Crown of England for him and his family to reside in America which placed him and his family on the same footing with the people of the crown, a matter of great importance as the Jews were far from being on the same footing with the people of the Christian faith."

Notes for Daniel Gomez

Daniel met and married a member of an ancient Sephardic family in Jamaica, Rebecca de Torres. After five years she died in childbirth, and Daniel subsequently found another bride in Curacao, Esther Levy. His brother, Benjamin, likewise found a bride in Jamaica.

David took six years to build the Gomez (1717-23) house and it served as a trading post besides the Gómez family home.

When the Revolutionary war broke out, the occupation of New York by Hessian and British troops caused the Jews concern, for two-thirds or more of the Jews were solidly in support of the revolution, despite the fact that such a position was against the commercial interests of many of them. The synagogue was obliged to close its doors, and Daniel was among the many Jews who fled to areas held by the revolutionaries. He and his family moved to Philadelphia, the heart of the American patriotic movement, where he became one of the founders of a new Sephardic congregation, the Mikveh Israel.

Notes for Uriah Hendricks

The firm that eventually came to be known as Hendricks & Brothers (and later, Hendricks Brothers) was founded by Uriah Hendricks (1737-1798). Uriah Hendricks was born in Amsterdam and emigrated from London to New York in 1755. Once in New York, he opened a dry goods store and became an active member (and, in 1791, president) of Congregation Shearith Israel. "Uriah Hendricks offers at his establishment on Broad Street, near the Exchange: 'Pepper in bales, likewise the very best of Russian and Ravens duck, extreme cheap,' and he further reminds the public that 'a few tickets for the State Lottery are daily expected, and that schemes may be seen at aforesaid store.'" - The Hebrews in America: A Series of Historical & Biographical Sketches, by Isaac Markens, 1975.

In 1764, Uriah established a metals business in the American colonies, importing copper and brass from England, which discouraged manufacture of these commodities in the colonies. Signed Royalist address to General Howe 1776.

Notes for Harmon Hendricks

Harmon Hendricks was a metallurgist, businessman and inventor who helped to transform the United States from an importer to a manufacturer of copper. His father, Uriah Hendricks, had established a metals business in the American colonies, importing copper and brass from England, which discouraged manufacture of these commodities in the colonies.

When Uriah Hendricks died in 1797, Harmon took over the metals importing company, as well as the family role in leading Shearith Israel, where he served as parnas from 1824 to 1827. He married Frances Isaacs in 1800 and together they had five children.

In 1812, during the American war with England, Hendricks and his brother-in-law Solomon Isaacs built one of the nation's first successful copper rolling mills in Soho, New Jersey. The Hendricks firm produced the copper used to sheath three Navy vessels in New York harbor at the same time that Paul Revere, a good friend of the Hendricks family, was cladding a fourth, the Constitution, with copper probably supplied by Hendricks. Hendricks supplied colonial patriot Paul Revere with copper for his smithing business. It is likely that colonial-era steeple bells chiming in the old cities of Boston, New York and Philadelphia were made by Paul Revere, in part with Hendricks copper. In addition, Hendricks made another contribution to the war effort by subscribing the then-considerable sum of \$40,000 to government issued war bonds.

When Harmon Hendricks died in 1838, his three sons and four grandsons succeeded him in the business. The last member of the family to operate the business was Harmon Washington Hendricks, who died in 1928.

Notes for Frances Isaacs

Frances Isaacs was born in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, the daughter of Justina Brandly Lazarus Isaacs and Joshua Isaacs. She married Harmon Hendricks, founder of the first copper industry in America, on June 4, 1800 and became the mother of thirteen surviving children.

Notes for John Lewis Lewis Goldstone (266)

John Lewis Goldstone attended Phillips Academy, Andover; Yale College P.H.B. 1930; Columbia L.L.B. 1935; served as attorney in U. S. Dept. of Justice (Southern District of New York); author of articles on taxation and foreign light spectacle at Independence Hall.

Among John's ancestors who played a notable part in the commercial, civic, and social life of New York City for over two and half centuries were: Abraham de Lucena, a contributor of 100 guilders to a fund raised in 1655 for repairing and strengthening the outer walls of the city (now New York) against attacks by the Indians; The Rev. Mr. A. de Lucena, son of Abraham, who subscribed in 1711 for the building of the steeple of Trinity Church; Harmon Hendricks who gave \$42,000 to the government for the War of 1812 (one of the largest subscribers), built the first copper rolling mill in America, and also connected in business with Paul Revere; Amelia Bernard Lazarus who founded the Prix de Rome - her name is inscribed on a bronze plaque near entrance to Metropolitan Museum among those "Benefactors of the Museum during the first half century of struggle and growth"; Emma Lazarus who wrote poem on the Statue of Liberty - and now on Receiving Building at Idlewild (now Kennedy) Airport; Lafayette Anthony Goldstone (1876-1956) who was a distinguished a successful architect in New York. John's mother, Aline Lewis Goldstone, is a poet writing under the name of "May Lewis."

Notes for Jeanette Kilham (266)

Jeannette was a graduate of Winsor School, Boston, and School Museum Fine Arts, Boston; studied briefly in later years at Academie Ranson, Paris, and with Fernand Leger and Hans Hoffman in New York; three one-man shows in New York.
